From the Pastor's Desk

The Way of Light or the Way of Darkness. Television of the 1950's through the 1970's has been accused of being unreal, of being too sweet in its presentation of life. Yet, television today is no less real. Rather, it presents a world where getting even is the prevalent attitude and sweetness is virtually non-existent. If this is the "real" world, then our work is really cut out for us as Jesus' followers.

An early Christian document from around the year 90AD called the "Didache" was written to lay out the necessary instruction for those who were seeking to become a disciple of Jesus through the sacrament of initiation in the Church; that is, Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. This instruction begins by being very clear, that there are two ways that lie open to every person: the way of light or the way of darkness. No gray area here. Choosing the way of light is not just a one-time decision, but an everyday decision to be in the world as a light of forgiveness, compassion and generosity. The same is true for the way of darkness. It produces its fruit to those who follow that way, the sour fruit of conflict, envy, hatred, greed and selfish motives.

Jesus ushers in the way of light which clearly shows the malice involved in the way of darkness. The way of light seeks to remake the world and all its concerns. Compassion, not self-interest, is a keystone in rebuilding the world in its original goodness, as God created it. Not just any kind of compassion but a compassion that is God-like. When you and I accept this into our lives to be lived, we become most God-like. Now God's compassion should not be confused with "permission." The expectation of God is laid out for us plainly in the Ten Commandments and their fulfillment in the command to love as Christ loves. This love is not blind but seeks the ultimate good for each person, which often times is not the good feeling of the present moment.

Many people grew up thinking God was the one who judged not justly, but harshly. Jesus makes it clear that God's judgment on us will be just, not harsh. Indeed, God's judgment on you and me will be solely based on the measure of compassion you and I handed out to others. If we seek revenge, then that will be our judgment; if we hope for others to be hurt, then that will be our judgment; if we, as a society, seek domination over others, then that will be our judgment. If we avoid calling ourselves and those we love to be holy, as Christ asks of us, then we might not be able to hear the Good Shepherd when He calls at the last. Not only would you and I suffer what we inflict, but we would find that our lives are miserable in the here and now.

BUT, we have another route to follow. To act out of compassion, even when we are hurt, brings us compassion. The path of forgiveness brings mercy to us. There is a peace that settles over those who don't spend time worrying about how to get even or fretting over or holding a grudge. To be faithful to God's call, holiness, by the grace of the Holy Spirit, overcomes our complacency to be simply good in the eyes of the world.

The qualities Jesus enjoins on us today in the Gospel are human, they are not unrealistic. What is unreal and inhumane is to treat another as if you or I were not related to them, for we are by our common humanity. My living out of compassion and your living out of compassion are what bring a new world order, not governments or secret societies. The new world order we establish is not ours but God's.

Your Gifts, Expertise and Enthusiasm Are Needed! For our parish to function well, the gifts and talents you possess are needed. Participating a bit more in parish life has its rewards and gives people who have done so a new and more vibrant insight into what it takes to make St. Mike's tick. We need your help with six important councils/committees: the Parish Pastoral Council, the Finance Council, the St. Michael School Advisory Committee, the Home and School Committee, the Sports Advisory Committee and the Faith Formation Advisory Committee.

There are no nominations and no elections. Committee members are determined through a process of DISCERNMENT. This is the same way the Apostles came to choose those who would help them. The discernment process is painless, and even a bit fun. You and other interested parishioners simply attend two Thursday evenings, March 6th and March13th, 7:00 PM-8:30 PM. The two evenings depend on each other and assist you in knowing the functions of these different groups and the issues with which they are dealing.
