### From the Pastor's Desk

**You Get What You Measure.** It is a universal reality that you cannot know how far you have come unless you know where you started; whether it is travel, saving money, growing in knowledge, falling in love or maturing in self-understanding. We only know how far we have progressed to a goal if we measure that progression.


This is true of our parish as well. There are certain measurements that are helpful like: how many parishioner families do we have now as compared to 15 years ago, or how many baptisms have happened this year as compared to prior years, etc. One such measurement is the Parish Pastoral Plan (PPP). Yes, we have had one. Members of different ministries and certainly the Pastoral and Finance Council know about this pastoral plan that was initiated nearly 20 years ago. Many of the objectives and goals of that plan for the parish school and the parish ministries and activities have been accomplished. Other goals and objectives have been added as original objectives were satisfied.

In the coming weeks, the full PPP, initiated in 2007, will be posted on our website along with all that has been accomplished or established as ongoing objectives. Much has been accomplished in the areas of Spirituality and Worship, Education and Formation, Parish Life, Peace and Social Justice, and Stewardship. Now, the stage is set for us to set our gaze outward, to embrace more fully the call to be not just disciples but missionary disciples.

In marking our 150th anniversary, the Pastoral and Finance Councils have begun the process of formulating a new Parish Pastoral Plan (PPP). The PPP encompasses all of our activities and ministries and certainly the most significant ministry of our parish school and faith formation.

Over the past two months, the two Councils have worked together to set the foundation of a new PPP. That foundation is encapsulated in two statements. The first, a Vision that is long range and inspires us forward in the spirit of the Bishop's call to "Proclaim Jesus as Lord." The second, a more detailed statement of Mission. Both are on the front of our bulletin this week.

Bishop McClory has, at the behest of the Holy Father, established this as the #1 priority in his pastoral letter. From these two touchstones, our parish will begin to formulate a new plan to help us understand what we, as a parish, need to set in place to realize our Vision and our Mission. In the coming months, the Pastoral Council will undertake a thorough review of our present five Commission structure. It has worked well for us but there is a need to look at it with refreshed eyes.



This Lent, all parishioners will be asked to take a survey, "Disciple Maker Index." It is an online survey to help clarify resources and needs for future planning not only in our parish but in the Diocese as a whole. Fr. Robert will speak more about this next week.

In the fall, all who are interested will be invited to participate in an exercise of gazing into our present and possible future identifying our strengths, our weaknesses, our opportunities and any threats to our success. The results of this exercise will be collated and be used to begin setting the goals and objectives of a new PPP.

I am thankful for the dedication and work of two our parishioners who have extensive professional experience in this area of strategic planning; Bob Solorio and Ted Markiewicz are to be commended for sharing their talent and time to this important endeavor. In advance, I also wish to thank Fr. Robert and Kimberley Hoogeveen for their extra effort to make our parish's participation in the upcoming Disciple Maker Index (DMI) a success. I cannot emphasize enough the need for every parishioner to take the time to do the DMI assessment when it is made available to us. Our future depends upon your participation.

### THE WORD


(Readings for March 16, 2025, the Second Sunday of Lent)



Moses told the story of the Israelites: The Lord God led them from bondage to freedom. This story should always be recalled before offering gifts to God. The people of God can rejoice over the many good things the Lord has given them.



God's word is on your lips and in your heart. If you proclaim with your lips that Jesus is Lord and believe it in your heart, you will be saved. "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."



Jesus was led by the Holy Spirit into the desert for forty days. There He ate nothing and was tempted by the devil. Afterward, the devil left Him to await another opportunity.
