From the Pastor's Desk

Inner Sight. As I began my sixth grade year, at Our Lady of Grace School, my studies were suffering. At first I was just frustrated, like any sixth grader would be, and my parents were concerned. I was not a straight A student but, I rarely did worse than B's or C's. My mother noticed, though, that I was sitting closer and closer to the television. So we went to the eye doctor. It was not a pleasant experience. I remember them putting all these drops into my eyes, and my eyes burning. After an appointment that seemed like a day long, I emerged with a prescription for eye glasses. When my glasses came in and I put them on for the first time, it was like a miracle. Everything at a distance was clear. No longer was I squinting and I could sit on the couch to watch my favorite television show, Family Classics on WGN.

Being able to see clearly is a great gift. The incident of the man born blind, related to us in John's gospel, should be very accessible to us. To lose one's sight is a scary thing, to be born without it, is not so much scary, as it is perplexing. You wouldn't readily understand what sighted people were describing to you. You would have to rely on your other physical senses in order to survive. Indeed, as scary as it is for the sighted to lose their sight, it can be just as scared for this man born blind to now receive his physical sight.

Those who can see, even with hardware, like myself, often believe our eyes, even when they do not always reveal the truth. It is an accepted fact, in criminal cases, that eye witness testimony is often faulty. We allow our eyes to dominate our other physical senses and so are impoverished even though we may behold beautiful sights. Often, our over reliance on our physical sight shadows our need to develop our spiritual sight. That is one point of the story about the man born blind.



Though he is blind physically, he allows his other senses to lead him to Christ. When he is given sight, he sees more than just the colorful world around him. He sees with clear vision through the eyes of his heart. As the story progresses, all those people who would see him day after day begging, don't see him. They become blind to this "new" person who sees Jesus as a prophet. When his parents are called in, his parents do not recognize him (in a sense) because he sees who Jesus really is, the "one sent from God."

How easy it is to depend on our eyesight and not develop our inner eyesight. The caution for you and me is not to be so convinced of our insights about others, or the world we live in, or the fragile state of our security. The eyes of our heart are more accurate than the eyes in our head. It is those eyes that Jesus wants to heal. The eyes of our heart can easily become clouded with fear, anxiety, anger, distrust and passion. This is why Jesus came, to open those eyes to trust in His providence, to see His mercy calling you and me to come closer to Him, to be fully sighted as God is towards each one of us.

When I ask God to open the eyes of my heart it can be a scary thing. I am asking God to help me see the whole world differently. Such a move jeopardizes ideas and perceptions that I thought I saw/knew clearly. Faith in God's love is the only thing that can lead you and me to allow Jesus to open the eyes of our hearts even wider than they are today. The alternative is for our eyes to grow even darker, like the parents, the neighbors and the Pharisees and Chief Priests in the story presented.


A prayer for you and me this week: O Lord, open my eyes to really see your glory, your colorful Presence in all the people around me, and your mercy that beckons me to trust that you will always care for me; so I can be brave to proclaim you as my Savior, not just in word but in deed, giving of myself just as you give yourself to me. Amen.

We have made incredible progress on the campaign so far, but as of Monday, March 13th, the participation rate of the campaign was just under 10%. As our campaign continues, we will need sacrificial gifts at all levels and the support of all parishioners to be successful. Our campaign is about growing together into the future, but it is also about moving forward with hope. It is our hope that future generations of parishioners will reap the seeds we have sown, just as we now enjoy the fruits of the sacrifices of previous generations of parishioners.


