

From the Pastor's Desk

Do You Believe? Raising someone from the dead is a quite a spectacular event. It is no wonder that we have our attention focused on that part of the Lazarus story that has Jesus facing the tomb saying "Lazarus, come out!" But the event of the raising of Lazarus is more than a spectacle of God's power. It takes a long time to get to the actual "bringing Lazarus back from the dead" event.

Most of the story is about something more important. Indeed, without it, the raising would not have happened. Often the more important elements of Gospel stories lie not in the action taken but in the interior disposition of the characters in the story.

This is no different in our life today. Our interior disposition to the Word of God is far more important than what we think about is the Word of God. If the salvation of the world was dependent upon Christians giving their intellectual accent or agreement to the message of Jesus, then the final consummation of all things would have happened.

The problem is not that we, faithful members of Christ's Church, do not agree in our mind with the principles of unity, forgiving, loving as Christ loves, service, and care for others, etc... The problem is that our hearts are slow to accept what our minds know. The reasons being are that our hearts, or better our misguided intentions (presumptions) that fuel our hearts, and consequently our actions, need conversion.

Notice in the story, Jesus solicits from Martha her profession of faith. Martha says "I know Lord; if you had been here my brother would have lived." This is Martha's "right" brain working. She "knows" Jesus could save the day. But Jesus wants more, He says: "But do you believe..." and she responds with her heart: "I have come to know and believe that you are the Christ." This is the practical Martha who earlier in the Gospel was worried about feeding Jesus more than listening to Him. Take note, Mary (Martha's sister) doesn't make this profession. It is Martha who moves what she knows from her head to her heart. This movement puts her on the way to conversion, to turning fully towards God.

This is the move you and I need to make. Sometimes we make it and sometimes we don't make the move. The move is made in practical elements of our life: "I know it is wrong to be prejudice, but I still harbor and even express my prejudice." We are willful in not allowing our knowledge to find a home in our heart. All agree that life is sacred, the Old Testament and the Gospels makes this clear, but some who call themselves Christians *feel* that a woman has a choice. Abortion is a private matter. Since when is life and death a private matter? Our heart has to get in line with what we know is our truth.

How can we change? First, we must all admit that we often don't see things as Christ sees them. Second, we need to take seriously the Scripture and the direction it sets for us as followers of Christ. Third, we have to recognize the sure and subtle ways that Satan wishes to divide God's Church. Because divided we fall, we cannot show others Christ, and if we cannot do this, God's plan of salvation is thwarted.

The Sacrament of Confession deals with all three and with the many things we do contrary to God's will for us. St. John reminds us that "to say I have never sinned, is to make Jesus a liar." Jesus came and died for us because we are sinners, and only His blood could wash away this stain. Growing into a sinless life is only possible through the sacrament of confession. Take advantage of the many opportunities we have in the next two weeks. There are several Penance Services where up to 12 priests will be available to offer you the peace of reconciliation with God. Monday, March 31st there will be a Penance Service at 10:30 AM. Another will happen on Tuesday, April 1st at 7:00 PM (no fooling). Saturday, April 5th, confessions will be 3:00-4:30 PM with 2 priests available. On Wednesday, April 9th there will be another Penance Service at 7:00 PM and on Saturday, before Palm Sunday, April 12th confessions will be 2:30-4:30 PM with 3 priests available.

Bring those attitudes that need God's healing love. Come forward and confess those things or attitudes that misdirect your steps and lead you to sin. Come and know the weight that God longs to remove from you so you can see more clearly God's hand in yours as you walk towards Easter joy.

Before we get to the spectacular, you and I need to deal with the foundational. Like Martha, we need to be open to God's grace to make the move, to be willing not willful, to be able to accept what we know is true into our hearts and so into our everyday actions.
