

From the Pastor's Desk

A Fourth Century Pilgrimage. Today when we go on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land or to Rome or to Fatima or Lourdes we go in luxurious comfort. On the flight over the Atlantic, we are served a hot dinner, cocktails and wine and treated to movies galore. While there, we travel by a comfortable motor coach and stay in 4-Star hotels. When we are hungry for a snack, we pick up a Dove ice cream bar. This was not the case in days past.

There is a diary that was discovered in 1884 by the Italian scholar, Gian Francesco Gamurrini, in a monastic library in Arezzo, Italy. This diary was attributed to a certain Christian Lady, named Egeria, who made a pilgrimage to the Old Testament and New Testament biblical sites. What is most fascinating about this journey is that it was taken sometime between the years of 318-384 AD, when travel was not easy nor safe, especially for a woman. Egeria (Etheria), was certainly a Lady of some means, but she also belonged to a group of women who dedicated themselves to service of God and neighbor. Her diary is correspondence written back to the "sisters" in Spain.

For us, what is most interesting is her detailed description of Holy Week, which she calls the "Great Week" in Jerusalem. We hear her relate to us many of the activities we have grown accustomed to in remembering Christ's passion, death and resurrection. She gives a fine description of the Palm Sunday procession which began outside the city on the opposite hill; and how the Bishop would ride on a donkey, like Jesus, with the people following ahead of him and behind, escorting their shepherd to the main church located by Golgotha and the tomb of Jesus.

We also hear of the gathering on the evening of Holy Thursday, to remember the beginning of the passion. On Good Friday, she tells us that all would gather in the courtyard which was the location of Golgotha and there, before a cross that marked the spot of Jesus' crucifixion, the Bishop would proclaim the Passion narrative. "All," she writes, "would be so moved by the sufferings of the Lord, that they would wail and cry loudly." Then the Wood of the Cross would be brought out for veneration by the Elect, and all the faithful. She also recounts the great Easter Vigil in some detail.

What is most interesting over all is that the three days, we call the Triduum, were treated as one big day. People were directed after each service, sometimes two or three a day, to return to home and rest and then be back in the church by such and such a time. Obviously, people had to work, but during these three days it was not prayer that interrupted work but work that would interrupt prayer.

Coming to the liturgies of these three days is important if you believe that God did something fantastic for you back in Jerusalem. However, that is not always possible, but Egeria reminds us that we can still mark these days with prayer, and fasting and celebration even if we cannot be in church. Remembering the Last Supper at your Thursday meal. Keeping silence on Good Friday from Noon until 3:00 PM, abstaining from TV, internet, texting, etc....., preparing yourself for Easter by fasting on Good Friday and Holy Saturday until the Easter Vigil. There are many ways to bring your faith home. It is, after all, a faith that has endured through the ages. A person like Egeria reminds us how connected we are to all that happened in Jerusalem and that still happens today.

You might not board a plane and enjoy the journey to the Holy Land, but you can still walk in the way of the Lord during the last days of this week. Jesus is calling to you and your family "Follow Me."






MASS OF REMEMBRANCE


