From the Pastor's Desk

The Unexpected Visit. My mother would warn us when we dropped a fork at dinner, "someone is going to come and visit." With this prophetic announcement, we would anxiously wait to see if she was right. Waiting for an expected visitor is one thing, but being surprised by an unexpected visit evokes a whole other set of feelings.

When we are surprised, many feelings come into play. We might feel shocked, a sense of unbelief and even a little offended and put out. Perhaps this is how the disciples feel when Jesus first appears to them after His resurrection. Surely they remember, as they see Jesus before them, their abandonment of Jesus in the garden and even their denials that they ever knew Him. Yet, Jesus' response to all these painful memories and the feelings they bring is simply "*peace*." Jesus gives His peace to calm fears, to relieve any offense, and to open unbelieving eyes. This peace is not like anything you or I can manufacture with good intentions and compromise. This peace is all about forgiveness that knows no compromise, it just is.

Thomas finds it hard to believe and so do we many times. We find it difficult to believe that God forgives me everything, and we find it even



more difficult to believe that we are to do the same with others as God does with us. Thomas, however, is open to believing and He does in the end. After experiencing God's presence in our lives, do we believe or do we expect further proof? We are all prone to doubting but are you and I just as willing to believe that Jesus is really alive in our life, in this day and age? He is alive when we join Him in offering to those who hurt us the same peace He offers to you and me.

The lesson Thomas teaches is not about doubting but believing. He is unjustly remembered as the doubting Thomas. This is sad because his greater act was the ability to move beyond doubt to belief.




