

From the Pastor's Desk

The Master Gardener. If you have ever had grape vines on your property, you know that every few years they need to be trimmed. If the vines are left alone, they become "wild" and begin to choke each other off. The result is a lot of dead wood and vines that do not produce a good fruit. It is true that branches and their leaves are necessary, because through photo-synthesis they nourish the main vine, but they are not the main source of nourishment, the roots are. An overabundance of smaller branches can drain important energy from the rest of the plant. Thus, the need for trimming, too much strain on the root system and the whole vine dies.

As you and I know, there can be no branches, no fruit, without the main vine. On the other side of the coin, the vine depends on the branches to bear fruit. This relationship between vine and branch is a natural sign of our relationship with our Lord Jesus and the work we are called to do as His disciples. Too many dead branches hanging on the vine drain strength from the whole plant. That is why branches have to be kept healthy, alive and fruitful. Remember the purpose of the vine is to produce fruit through the branch. This is our purpose in relation to our Vine, Jesus. The fruit we produce is good works, prayer and the giving of ourselves for God's service to others.

Life is full of its challenges and blessings. When we are a fruitful branch, we know that often our challenges blossom into blessings of one sort or another. Sometimes, we unfortunately spend more energy and time being held captive by the challenges that enter our lives. When this happens to us, we need to remember that we are rooted in Jesus. If He conquered death, He can certainly help me to move beyond my challenges to embrace generosity so much fruit can be produced. In this, He even gives the example. In His most challenging hour, His passion and death, He gives freely the fruit of God's mercy to the thief who asks Him: "Jesus,



remember me when you come into your kingdom." There is a verse in an ancient hymn that envisions this moment as the thief "plucking the fruit from the Vine of eternal life."

Jesus offers us in all circumstance of life the ability to "pluck" that fruit which is His gracious Presence. He that can lead us away from the obsession of "not having enough" to the healing power of thankfulness and its fruit, generosity. As branches on the vine, the fruit we produce is meant to be "plucked" by those in need of God's work. It is not our duty to judge who needs the fruit and who does not. It is our duty to produce it through the strength of Jesus and, willing, to give it for the "plucking." This is what gives Glory to God.




MOTHER'S DAY/FATHER'S DAY MASS CARDS
