## From the Pastor's Desk

*How to Get to the Green Pasture.* Most of us have no experience of sheep or shepherds. Perhaps you petted a sheep once in a petting zoo, but you most properly did not have to lead the sheep to green pastures or have to clean up after them, a nasty business. No, when we hear about sheep and shepherds, we conjure up nice, sweet, romantic notions of lush rolling hails, CLEAN sheep and restful responsibilities on the part of the shepherd. This is as far from the truth as is Chicago from Beijing.

Sheep are rarely "clean" and shepherds don't have it easy. Trying to lead a bunch of cute but self-determined animals to what's best for them and keep them from all kinds of danger, that might very well kill them, is not a laidback occupation. This is why Jesus uses this image, not once, but several times in the Gospels. He wants to make clear to us that we are like sheep, restless, self-determined, even if it means we'll be harmed. We are not fresh and clean but smelly in our faults, easily preyed upon and easily snatched away. That is us. We are like sheep.

Jesus is the shepherd. Not only does He put up with us, He loves each and every one of us. He offers His very life for us, a bunch of stupid sheep. Why? Because He knows of what we are made. You and I might act like sheep sometimes, but we have the capacity to be like the Shepherd. We have the ability, by God's grace, to seek out the true green pastures. We have the ability through God's mercy, to know how much we are loved and we have the gifts to be a shepherd for other people as well.

Jesus shows us how to be both good sheep and good shepherds. He was like a lamb led to the slaughter; He was obedient to God in all things. He shows us how to be sheep; listen to Him, the one God has sent. He shows us how to be good shepherds, be on guard – look out for others, even to the point of laying down your life for them.



Care for the sheep, feed the poor, cloth the naked, teach and inspire the ignorant; lead your children, your friends, your spouse to the real green pastures of God's promise, not to the disappearing oases of present culture which promises nourishment but really starves us. The Good Shepherd leads us to true food, to true nourishment, to real fulfillment. Stupid sheep we are not, redeemed sheep we are. Let us live every day in the reality of who we are, God's Flock destined for Eternal Life.




*First Communions.* Next week we are celebrating the First Communions of our third graders at the 9:30 and 11:30 AM Masses. The Eucharist, and consequently communion, is an Easter sacrament. This too is a reason for celebrating this special sacrament together at Sunday Mass. It helps all of us remember our First Communion Day and perhaps encourages us to recommit ourselves to receiving the Body and Blood of the Lord with even more devotion and openness.


