

### From the Pastor's Desk

*God's way can be confusing when we want to be in charge.* Confusion, disorder and the unexpected are all states of living that most people try to avoid. We generally don't like it when things get out-of-hand. The first reaction is to put things back into order. Despite our attempts to calm the confusion we find, more often than not it will not be calmed, at least for any length of time. Thus, we still find ourselves confronted by disorder and confusion. It comes as no news that life has been this way for thousands of years.

Jesus' family, Mary and the relatives, even get caught up in this futile attempt to control the uncontrollable. They come to "take charge" of Jesus because, as St. Mark tells us, they think Jesus is "out of His mind." Well, with all His preaching and attracting of huge crowds that won't let Him even eat, Jesus' family wonders if their kin is being a little too pious, a little too radical. Perhaps, they even fear that He will draw unwanted attention from the Romans who rule their land and so cause problems for everyone.

Whatever the reason for the family wanting to collect Jesus and calm the frenzy that His presence is causing, Jesus makes it clear that He acts out of God's power. Only God's power makes order from disorder and calm from confusion. The finger of God works in what we consider the unexpected. God is at work in the son of a carpenter from Nazareth, God is at work making Satan flee from troubled hearts, God is at work and no one, not Jesus' family, the Scribes, or the leaders of the people expected it to be this way.



From this, we could take a lesson to expect God in the unexpected. When things aren't going our way, it might be an invitation from God to "let go and let God" act. Expecting everything to be "just so," whether it's how our family should act or not act or whether it's how the grass should be cut or how the candles arranged in the sanctuary can lead to our not seeing God at work. God's ways are not our ways and God's thoughts are not our thoughts. *Stop – Look – Listen* because God is inviting us to see things through Jesus' eyes.

The Town of Schererville was founded in 1866 by Nicholas Scherer, who moved there with his wife, Francisca and their family a year later. Early Schererville residents attended church in neighboring towns until 1873, when Francisca petitioned Most Rev. Joseph G. Dwenger, Bishop of the Diocese of Fort Wayne, to establish a parish in Schererville. Bishop Dwenger reluctantly gave his consent, and Nicholas Scherer donated four and a half acres of land for the church and a cemetery. A building committee was formed and construction on a hilltop white-framed church measuring 45 x 90 feet and having a 100-foot spire began. The total cost was \$5000. submitted by the 150th Anniversary Committee
