Being the Body and Blood of Christ. In our celebration today of the Body and Blood of Christ, Corpus Christi, we commemorate the great act of Christ's love in giving us His Body and Blood both at the Last Supper and at the great sacrifice of Calvary. Our thoughts should turn to "***why***" we have been given this special gift. As we eat and drink the Body and Blood of Christ, St. Augustine would say, "to proclaim both who we are and who we hope to become." In modern parlance, we would say, "We are what we eat."

True Eucharistic worship begins by living the Eucharist we take part in week after week. The reason for the Eucharistic presence of Christ is to continue to transform us into a more perfect "Body of Christ" whose presence changes the world.

All of the intricate arguments of "***how***" Christ becomes present in the elements of bread and wine, though important, must take a second place to the reason "***why***" Christ becomes present to us in this special way. You and I give true honor to the Blessed Sacrament when we allow this great mystery to transform us, in and through Christ's name.

We are called to be a "blessed sacrament" for the world. In the ancient Roman world, the Emperor's soldiers would receive a *sacramentum*. This sacramentum was a mark, like a tattoo, that would set them apart as belonging to the Emperor. Anyone could see this mark and when they did it was as if the Emperor himself was present. The Roman soldier's sacramentum struck fear into people.

It is interesting that early Christians use this same concept to speak of Jesus. Jesus is the sacramentum, the obvious mark of God in the world. When you look at Jesus, you encounter God. The followers of Jesus also receive a sacramentum, the mark of our baptism, the Sign of the Cross, that makes us belong to God, our eternal Emperor. When people see you and me, they should encounter Christ.

In communion, we reaffirm that mark, that sacramentum, we received in baptism. In this, not only do we encounter God, but we become a place where other people can encounter God through us. Unlike the Roman soldier whose sacramentum was meant to strike fear in the people, our sacramentum is meant to elicit wonder and awe in the God we represent and so invite others into love, not fear.

Communion as a sacrament makes us into the very presence of Christ. It marks us out and invites others to encounter in us the Risen Christ. This encounter is meant for our work places, our schools, our baseball fields, our clubs, our neighborhoods, indeed in every aspect of our worldly life.

In the past two years, many have returned to the Table of the Lord following the permission that relaxed the obligation to attend Mass during the COVID situation. However, we have lost nearly 25% of those who attended Sunday Masses in 2019. This is a statistic reflected in all of our parishes. No doubt some, having been given permission to "miss" coming to church for a valid reason, have decided that they are doing just fine without coming to weekly Mass. This is unfortunate.


Life might seem just fine without Sunday Mass for a while, but soon the burdens of the prince of this world, Satan, can and do become quite heavy. I personally see this in the number of divorces, family problems and unhealthy habits that lead not to drawing one closer to God and to preparing ourselves to be ready to accept His gift of Peace but, drives persons into the camp of death. The number of suicides alone have adversely affected life expectancy statistics in this nation. It is hard to live for anyone, even one's self, when separated from God. Being united to God is not a mental exercise or an idea; it is a real practical exercise that involves, not just personal prayer, but participation in the act of Christ's Sacrifice (the Mass) to be able to be intimately united to Christ in Holy Communion.

The effect of the dispensation is unfortunate but it was given following the directive of the Lord Himself when He told Peter and the Apostles that "whatever you bind on earth is bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth is loosed in heaven." This directive from Jesus is what is handed down to the successors of the Apostles, the Bishops. As the expectation was loosened for a time during the crisis, it is now, once again, binding.

Granted most people reading this will be those who regularly attend Sunday Mass. I would ask you to encourage your family and neighbors who "used to go" to go again. Prolonged absence from the Eucharist can lead to amnesia, the loss of remembering what God has done and does for us even today.

In the end, we must remember that receiving the Body and Blood of Christ is far more than filling up with grace to get through the trials of the week. It is a participation in the work of Christ that not only helps us through the week but is far more powerful. It helps us to bring Christ to the world in our daily living, a world that is always in need of encountering the healing presence of God. This is "***why***" we come to God's Altar each week, to become more and more of who we are marked out to be, His presence in the world.


LAST CHANCE TO PURCHASE FATHER'S DAY MASS CARDS


