From the Pastor's Desk



Sharing the Melody. When I was a young child, my older sister had a desire to learn how to play the organ. So, my parents bought a Sears Chord Organ. As I watched her learn how to move her fingers over the keys, learning how to choose the proper keys corresponding to the notes on the page in front of her, I was intrigued. Soon she began to let me try. Her first concert and mine were not in an auditorium or a hall but in our living room. The guests were my mom and dad and grandparents. Thank goodness we began in an intimate venue. Later, I would play in chapel at the seminary, but only after years of playing for a more limited audience.

In the Gospel today, Jesus sends out the twelve to preach His message of repentance and preparation because “the Kingdom of Heaven is at hand.” In this first missionary sending, Jesus is clear, don’t go into pagan territory, only go to the “lost sheep of Israel.” Why this admonition? Clearly, Jesus understood that the message they were going to bring presumed some background understanding on the part of the listeners. This advantage would be encouraging to the apostles as they begin to get used to doing this kind of work. They would not have to devise creative ways of explaining Jesus’ message to the Gentiles, who knew nothing of the notion of “one” God or the Prophets or the Law of Moses. They were just starting out. They needed a limited audience until they could better incorporate Jesus’ teachings into their own lives more readily. They were just learning the primary notes of the melody; the accompaniment would come later.

In Paul’s letter to the Romans, an audience of mixed origin, some Jewish many Gentile, we see a broader understanding of why we need to repent and prepare for the Kingdom of God. The passion, death and resurrection of Jesus provided the broader accompaniment to the main melody line drawn out by the Law and the Prophets. Paul, in simple logic, plays the theme: God, who had no reason other than love, to take on human flesh in the womb of the Virgin Mary, has acted on our behalf to free us from the death of sin/selfishness when we were most unlovable. Indeed, we put Him to death and yet He has still acted on our behalf. If now, we believe in His merciful love and act out of that belief, how can we not think that He will give us the fullness of Life in the Kingdom to come?

Knowing this reality in our daily lives becomes the challenge and a blessing for all who look for the peace the world cannot give. It is a challenge because we are regularly confronted with the temptation to put ourselves first; to act in our own interest, to use others for our good, to remain, in a sense, unlovable. You and I are challenged like the Apostles to go outside of our comfort zone and tell others about God’s awesome work in our lives. It is a blessing because it invites us to grow deeper in our relationship with God. When we think of the other first and use ourselves for their good, we imitate our Leader, our Inspiration, our Lord, Jesus. When we imitate Him, you and I slowly become like Him. In becoming like Him, we are friends of God, not enemies. Sharing our story of turning towards God (conversion) strengthens us in our resolve to be better followers everyday and invites us to learn even more about God’s love for us.

The first place we share this story is with the limited audience of our spouse, our children and grandchildren. We join up with like-minded people and with them share our story with others, perhaps with a close friend or neighbors. Starting with an intimate audience allows us time to grow in knowledge of how to share our story of falling in love with God. There will be successes and rejections. The Apostles dealt with the same, but it did not stop them from sharing the Story. Someone shared the story with you, don’t let it stop there.

Former Parking Lot to Become Green Space. Many have noticed the unused parking lot on the northwest side of the church building is being removed. Two things to know: 1) We are not getting ready to build the proposed new administrative center; it will be built on the east side of the church building. 2) We are not putting in a new parking lot because we do fine without more paved parking and because it would cost around \$250,000.

What are we doing? We are preparing that space to return to “green space.” As our cemetery continues to service the needs of our parishioners, we have lost green space once used for parish social events. This space being cleared is not contiguous with the cemetery and so will never be used for that purpose. The work presently being done is being done gratis by one of our generous parishioners who is in the paving business. There will be a landscape design, as we move forward, making the space more than just an empty flat field. The completed green space will take some time (more than a year), because it is one of those projects that we are doing ourselves and look for the assistance of parishioners to help make possible. 




