From the Pastor's Desk

Two by Two. As we welcome the seminarian, Will O'Donnell, with us this summer, it is a reminder to us, especially to our younger men, that choosing a vocation as a priest is a very viable option and one that brings great joys. One of the joys is that you belong to a mission and a group of like minded people who are concerned about the same things you are concerned about. Also, belonging to this "community" of brothers provides one with healthy challenges to make you into an even better person with God's Grace. A seminarian, and thus a priest too, is always affiliated with a diocese. You cannot go on to a School of Theology with the intent of studying for the priesthood, without being affiliated. This meant that I could not choose any school I wanted when I was finished with my college. It would be a process of knowing where Bishop Grutka would be open to sending me (which was actually not a limited list) and then knowing how to make my pitch.

One rule the Bishop had was that we needed to have at least two people from the diocese at any given school. It just so happened that in 1980, the last two from our diocese at my chosen school, St. Meinrad School of Theology, had just been ordained. Though we had others in the college at St. Meinrad, we had no one in the School of Theology. The Bishop made it clear that I could attend St. Meinrad for Theology but I had to go, or better, my classmate had to go with me.

We had to go, like the Gospel relates, two by two. With my goal in mind, I began to work on my classmate. In the end he agreed. The Bishop wanted us to go in twos so that we could support one another. If I were the only one from my diocese in the school, I might be tempted to switch affiliation to another diocese. A diocesan brother could and would act as grounding. I don't think this policy is too far removed from a good understanding of human nature.

Well, Bishop Grutka wasn't the first to see the advantage of going "two by two." Jesus also sends His disciples out in pairs to support one another, to give courage to each other and to challenge each other, when appropriate, to stay on the mission Jesus gave them to accomplish.

It is no different for you. We consider our weekly Eucharist so important to our spiritual health that to miss it is a sin. By sin we mean, it diminishes our call as Christ's disciples, God's children; and it sets aside, in a willful fashion, the gifts of the Holy Spirit to grow in Christ. We need to be "two by two;" standing, sitting, kneeling, singing, listening to God's Word and praying next to each other to keep us on the right track. You and I are far less prone to wander from God if we honestly come before God each week and together offer ourselves to Him, through our Lord Jesus. In addition, it is also, as in today's Gospel reading, our time to "come away" with Jesus to unpack our week, our experience of trying to live as His disciple. A time for Jesus to refresh us.

The Holy Spirit also works wonders where two or more are gathered in prayer. Jesus did come to save us and He did intend to do that through a community, we call Church. The disciples could never really know what their mission was unless they stuck together to accomplish it; and we can never accomplish our calling to be Christ's followers unless we stick together. Sunday Eucharist and its Vigil on Saturday evening is the least we need to do.

This "two by two" perspective also makes it possible for us together to grow in our faith and to do wonderful and lasting things. We cannot accomplish providing for our parish to continue growth into the future if half of us are not present and if half that are present do not want to join in the good work that needs to be done. Events like the Fun Fest, our Feast Day celebration in September, the gathering of our children for religious instruction, the coming together in prayer groups and bible study groups are all ways we walk "two by two" and come to know who we are as God's people. For far too long, Catholics have treated being a member of Christ's Body, the Church, like belonging to a club that doesn't require really anything from its members.

All hands need to be on deck to help accomplish what is needed now and in the near future. Things like providing for a good learning environment for our children. All need to be concerned about the safety and accessibility of an administrative center supporting those who distribute groceries to the less fortunate and allowing everyone access to parish services. No one should be embarrassed because they can't make it up the steps. Being together is the only way we accomplish these and so may other good works. Resist the urge to be separate for it leads to separation from even more serious realities.



“A LOOK BACK IN TIME”

Francisca Scherer (pictured to the left with her husband) died in 1911 and upon her death willed the parish the land which would become Mount Calvary. In 1912, the rectory was enlarged and remodeled. In 1913, Rev. Charles Scholl, the first native son of Schererville ordained to the priesthood, celebrated his first Mass. In 1914, the parish built a convent for the sisters. The structure has been in use ever since and has been remodeled several times to serve the parish as a convent, rectory and currently the parish office. In 1916, a second story was added to the school to better serve the 126 students enrolled there.








CALLING ALL BAKING ENTHUSIASTS
