From the Pastor's Desk

Shepherds: The Good and the Bad. The world today is not much different than the world of years gone by. Oh yes, we can travel around the world quicker, “zap” our dinner in 60 seconds and hold in our hands more informational power than was ever imagined four decades ago. But, in essence, the most important need never changes. There is still the desire to love and to be loved.

In the Old Testament reading today, we hear about bad leaders and good leaders. Bad leaders are those who claim they work for God but instead work for their own desire to be fulfilled - not God's. You might think to yourself; “Who would want to follow a leader that is selfish and that in the end does not have my welfare at heart?” Yet, following this kind of leader is easier than we think.

It is good to remember that bad leaders are more than people; they are attitudes and movements in society too. Today, like years ago, there are those voices that tell us it's O.K. to walk over other people to get our “desire” fulfilled. Those other people might be neighbors, co-workers, strangers or even the poor a half-world away.

The constant movement of advertisers, our current leaders of trends and tastes, keep promising you and me some kind of happiness, some level of fulfillment and so we buy, we acquire, we shop. But, the fulfillment lasts but a short time until the “next big thing” arrives on the market that promises us the same as the last “big thing.” Could it be that the leaders of taste and trends don't serve you or me but serve their pocket book?

In a world driven by acquisition of either things or persons, it becomes easy to believe the leading publicity and promises because we do all want to be loved and we do all want to enjoy life and we do all want to be at peace. Yet, time and time again, our loyal following the path to the “good life” leaves us unfulfilled and Poorer, not just in money but also in spirit.

Though we are surrounded by what seems to be abundance, we begin to realize that it is our own and not God's abundance. If you and I seek this false abundance unchecked, we arrive not in an oasis of delight but a wilderness of passing fancies; a wilderness where although we have plenty to eat and drink, we still starve for what really satisfies.

It is in this wilderness that we have manufactured that God comes to you and me and speaks to us. In this Wilderness, we pass by each other as strangers and use others for our own ends. This wilderness is full of broken relationships and disunity. The good shepherds, in the pattern of the Good Shepherd, speak with a voice that ***gathers*** the flock in ***unity***. To live in unity with others is the concrete experience of God and it is central to our desire to love and to be loved. This desire is not realized in the struggle of winners and losers. Division under any circumstance makes the vision of God die.

Our common life together as God's people in St. Michael's Parish can only be enhanced by our self-sacrifice not our selfishness. Unity is enjoyed as a gift from God when you and I gift ourselves as a gift to each other. Sharing our talents and our time, and yes our treasure, to make Christ present in the world and so even more present to each of us. Disagreements arise, it is part of being human beings, but even in disagreement we are all slaves to charity and gentleness, not rancor and deception.

We do more to spread the message of God's presence in the world when we act with kindly hearts and speak gentle words toward each other. When you and I live and work together in ***unity***, we become those good shepherds God promises and we lead others and each other to a fuller realization of our common desire to love and to be loved — in God.





"A LOOK BACK IN TIME"

In the early 1920s, two religious brothers who had heard about the vandalism of 1893 were moved to erect the altar and statues on Mount Calvary, cast the install of the Stations of the Cross surrounding Mount Calvary and build the Lourdes Grotto, the Garden of Gethsemane Grotto and the Resurrection Grotto. In 1927, Fr. Berg celebrated 50 years of priesthood and Bishop John F. Noll elected him Right Reverend Monsignor. The parish was faced with the need for a new church building, and with the help of architects and contractors



broke ground for the new building on October 25, 1927. The cornerstone for the second church building was set on May 20, 1928. *Submitted by the 150th Anniversary Committee*

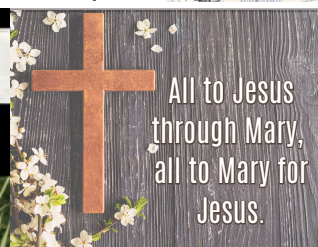

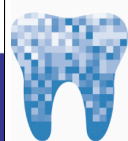


