From the Pastor's Desk

Give Them Something to Eat. The hardest thing to do is to change. We all like something new but we don't like it if it means I have to change. External change, on the other hand, like changing my environment with a new house, or a new relationship, or even a new job promises some degree of excitement. However, real change is another story. Real change is interior; changing my heart, or my mind or both. This is the change Jesus calls us to as His followers. Expecting meaningful personal growth by changing my external environment without attending to my internal environment is like rearranging the deck chairs on the Titanic. This is why real change (changing my perceptions and behaviors) is difficult and often avoided and substituted for the external.

Changing our interior is done with the grace of God. Alone it is nearly impossible, but with honesty towards God, we can receive the needed strength to change and become even better than you or I could imagine. The first thing that is necessary is to say what you mean and mean what you say. If you are a follower of

Christ then don't be shy about it. Let it show in your actions of patience, kindness, holding your temper and generosity. This is how "mean what you say" is exhibited.

Like last week, the Gospel story today begins with Jesus and the disciples trying to avoid the crowds. But once again the crowd follows Him and He responds not in anger or irritation but in surrender and love. The disciples, on the other hand, want the people to go away after Jesus is finished. But Jesus insists that they now follow His lead and surrender and give over what little they have to now feed the people. He expects them to act on the faith they have in Him and God's Word. They are to be examples to the crowd, in the pattern He has set; giving even the little they have so all can be fed.



Jesus wanted them to change their hearts, to embrace a conversion, to trust God as Jesus did. In their conversion, others were encouraged and challenged to act on Jesus' words that they

just heard. Everyone needed to sit down and practice what they so eagerly took-in in Jesus' preaching. There was to be no listening to God's Word and then running off as if trying to get out of the church parking lot before the final blessing.

God's Word expects a response from you and me. And so the people that day needed to respond to Jesus, beginning with the disciples. And what a response it was; for out of Jesus' power to change hearts, food appeared, enough for everyone and more.

Jesus trusted in God and was given strength to give, even when He wanted to be alone, to give even when He saw the cross. We, who so eagerly want to hear His Word, must act upon it trusting that we can give of our talents, time and treasures. Our trust will not be unfounded, but like the disciples, through the power of Jesus, you and I together will produce enough for all and surprise ourselves with left-overs too.

"A LOOK BACK IN TIME"



Monsignor William Berg died as he was concluding Mass on September 4, 1929. He was buried on Mount Calvary next to his brother, Rev. John Berg, who died in 1927. Rev. Leo Hildebrandt organized Monsignor Berg's funeral and cared for the parish until the appointment of Rev. Peter A. Biegel as pastor on October 4, 1929. The parish held its first festival to help defray the cost of constructing a new church, and Bishop Noll dedicated the new 500-seat church building complete with a 116-foot spire and pipe organ on May 18, 1930. The total cost was \$97,000. The first baptism, funeral and wedding in the new church were celebrated shortly thereafter.






