

From the Pastor's Desk

The Reality of Flesh and Blood. Every third year in the cycle of readings that are given for Sundays of the year, we are treated to, what scholars call, the Bread of Life Discourse. This "discourse" lasts for five weeks. It begins with the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves and the feeding of the five thousand by Jesus. This occasion happens, St. John tells us, near the feast of the Passover. This reference is given to relate this feeding to the Eucharist Jesus established on the night before He died during the Passover meal.

Today's Gospel is the crux of the dialogue Jesus has with His disciples and the crowd who misunderstands the sign of the multiplication of the loaves. We can sometimes be unfairly critical of those persons who experienced this miracle. However, we have two thousand years' worth of reflection on Jesus' death and resurrection and the gift of the Eucharist. It takes a little effort on our part to listen to this dialogue with the ears of those persons who first engaged it.

In honesty, we still have many who gloss over Jesus' plain words today. Jesus is clear that the bread and wine we eat and drink here in 2024 is His Body and His Blood. The consecrated elements of bread and wine become



His flesh and blood. This sounds to many people like cannibalism in Jesus' day and it sounds that way to many people today as well. That's why since Jesus first spoke about it until now, many reduce His words to allegory. Perhaps you yourself have even thought: "This can't really be the flesh and blood of Jesus, it is really a sign of that reality, but not that reality."

St. Thomas Aquinas, probably the most famous and brilliant theologian, taught us best in his song that he composed about the Body and Blood of Jesus:

By His word the WORD almighty makes of bread his flesh indeed, wine becomes his very life blood; Faith must heed God's living WORD; Faith alone may safely guide us, where the senses cannot lead.

Faith alone can take us to the moment when this bread and wine become His Body and Blood. This reality does not manifest itself in clouded human sight, but only with the clear eyes of faith. Jesus is truly present in our midst and remains so even when we are finished with Mass. God's presence does not hinge on my flawed human perceptions, but appeals to my deeper understandings where your soul and mine, clearly recognize this Eternal food, the Flesh and Blood of Jesus.

When the priest receives the Body of Christ, he prays silently "May the Body of Christ keep me safe for eternal life" and with the Blood: "May the Blood of Christ keep me safe for eternal life." Just another reminder that this food and drink, this Flesh and Blood, is given to us to change us into the image of Christ who lives forever. We can have the hope to live forever if we are "kept safe in Him" till the day of our death. In this way, our death is but a doorway to eternal life.

This is why Jesus multiplied the loaves; this is why He instructed the disciples and people about their meaning; this is why He makes Himself present to us in the here and now in His Body and Blood offered to us at every Mass and adored by us in the Tabernacle.


"A LOOK BACK IN TIME"



On June 9, 1958, Fr. Biegel became pastor emeritus and resided at the old rectory. Rev. Timothy Doody was appointed administrator of the parish and resided at a newly-constructed rectory which currently is used as a convent. In June 1959, Fr. Biegel celebrated 50 years of priesthood and Bishop Grutka allowed Capuchin priests to serve the parish, which they did until 1974. Fr. Biegel died on March 24, 1960, and is buried on Mount Calvary alongside Monsignor Berg, Fr. Berg and Fr. Scholl. The old rectory was demolished and Mount Calvary received a new altar and stone monuments in memory of the four

priests buried there.
