From the Pastor's Desk

Fr. Robert is taking over "From the Pastor's Desk" for the next four weeks.

What are Angels?

The average person has a very poor understanding of what an angel truly is. Artwork depicts them as human beings with wings, or worse, as naked little babies sitting on the clouds. Yet, if we actually saw them with the eyes of faith, we might die from sheer awe at their immense power and the beauty of God that reflects from them.

However, we need to remind ourselves continually that <u>angels don't "look" like anything at all</u><u>angels do not</u><u>have a body</u>, nor are they comprised of any matter. Angels are pure spiritual beings, pure intelligences. This means that angels have an intellect to know things, and they have a will to love things, but they don't have all the other things that we bodily creatures have. For instance, we have appetites for food and drink, and we have emotions as a result of hormones or chemicals in the brain; our brains also build memories and neural pathways, training us to operate in habitual ways without needing to think or focus on what we are doing. Without the influence of appetite, emotion, or habits, angelic spirits have a willpower that is completely free and potent</u>—whatever they love, they love with their whole being.

Furthermore, since they lack bodies, <u>angelic spirits are not contained in space and time as we are</u>. Indeed, they may sometimes act upon things in space and time, but angels themselves are not bound by the material world. This is why they seem to be so fast—and why we depict them with wings—<u>angels can "move" at the speed of thought</u> simply by choosing to act upon an object. In one moment, they can act upon the Pope in Rome, then in the next instant they can act upon me here in Schererville, Indiana!

Our thinking concerning angels gets even more confusing when we talk about their relation to time. Since angels reside beyond time, <u>whatever choices an angel makes are made forever</u>; there may be certain consequences of an angel's choices at certain moments in time when it seems the angel "enters into time and space," but the angel has made a perpetual choice since the moment of his creation, and his willpower never wearies, nor does he change his mind.

Also, because they exist outside of time, <u>angels do not learn</u> or gain an increase of knowledge. An angel received all the knowledge he would need for his purpose in life at the moment of his creation by God. It is as if God uploaded all their necessary files from the start, and much like a computer, they access those files and know this necessary information with ease—no corruption of files or decay of memory ever afflicts these bright angelic intelligences.

Moreover, <u>angelic spirits never die nor decay</u>. A spirit is not subject to corruption as a body is. The only way a spirit could "die" is for God to cease supporting its existence. But God loves the angels, meaning He wills them to exist forever. <u>The very existence and work of the angels gives glory to God</u>, so He loves to surround Himself with their company.

Feel small yet? Or maybe your head just hurts from all the gymnastics it has to do to understand the wonderful world of angels.

In the next article, I will discuss why God created the angels, what their mission is, and what happened to the angels who refused God's will for them.

"A LOOK BACK IN TIME"

In 1979, Rev. Joseph E. Vamos was appointed pastor. To help serve the parish's 1100 families, Fr. Vamos created parish office spaces in the mezzanine area of the lower level of the church and formed the parish's first Parish Pastoral Council. In 1980, the parish cemetery's grottos were renovated and reopened, and Mount Calvary was used for special Masses. As the parish grew to 1469

families, the parish added an additional weekend Mass in the lower level of the school, and numerous ministries and activities, including the parish choir, were revitalized. In 1982, the parish embarked on a capital campaign to replace the 1916 school building by building a



second story to the 1968 addition and constructing an all-purpose social/athletic center on the site of the old school. Submitted by the 150th Anniversary Committee




