From the Pastor's Desk

Choir of Angels

We love to give odd names to groups of creatures: a herd of buffalo, a flock of geese, a school of fish, a murder of crows, a congress of baboons—to name a few. We traditionally call a group of angels a "choir" or "rank," but why is that? Many of us don't give a second thought about the angelic realm or its structure, but if we did, we might discover an important lesson about the way God has intended to structure the world.

First of all, we should know that there is a countless number of angels, and every single one of them is one-of-a-kind. Whereas we exist as different members of the human species, sharing one human nature, each angel exists as his own species of angel, equipped with a unique angelic nature; no two angels are the same. Two angels may be as different as a horse is to an eagle, for instance. And yet, the angels may be grouped together according to their similar missions, the reasons God created them.

Therefore, we have the concept of choirs or ranks of angels, giving us two images: a group of singers or a group of soldiers. A choir has singers with different timbre of voice, and yet they can be grouped according to the part they are to sing: Soprano, Alto, Baritone, Bass. An army has officers with varying levels of experience and capability, and yet they are grouped according to the degree of authority and clearance to military intelligence they have received: General, Major, Captain, Private. In a similar way, all the angels in heaven form a hierarchy, wherein the most intelligent, most beautiful, most powerful angels are nearest to God, and because they are entrusted with the greatest "military secrets," they sing the highest pitch of God's praises. The angels lower in the hierarchy receive their orders and starting pitches from the higher angels, but everything comes originally from God.

The Church fathers referred to the transfer of illumination between the angels as a series of lenses. Just as we might go blind if we stared directly at the sun, the brightness of God's glory and wisdom is too intense for many spiritual creatures to gaze upon directly. However, if we took enough layers of shaded lenses (or a solar eclipse lens), we could eventually look at the light coming from the sun without being blinded. Thus, the ranks of angels act like layers of shaded lenses that filter out some of the brightness of God's glory, in order that angels of a weaker nature may receive it and understand the wisdom of God. Herein lies a secret within the angelic hierarchy: the greater angels serve the lesser angels in their mission.

But how many ranks of angels are there, and what are their missions? It is not for us to know exactly how the angelic world functions in all its complexity. St. Thomas Aquinas suggested that there are nine choirs or ranks of angels because there are nine different names referring to angels in Sacred Scripture: Angels, Archangels, Principalities, Virtues/Authorities, Powers, Dominions, Thrones, Cherubim, and Seraphim (Isaiah 6:2-3 | Ezekiel 10 | Romans 8:38 | Colossians 1:16 | 1 Peter 3:22 | Jude 1:9). By contrast, Pseudo-Dionysius thought that the names Thrones, Cherubim, and Seraphim all referred to the same rank of angel, those closest to God. What is important to know is that there is an order and structure in the spiritual world and that those spirits which most closely resemble God by reflecting His beauty and light shine upon other spirits, that they too may be illumined, until at last God's light shines upon us, mankind, through the spirits whose mission it is to watch over us. These guardian angels will be next week's topic.


Fr. Connolly blessed the bell tower of the new church building. In January 2001, Fr. Connolly began a sabbatical. On March 7th, Fr. Connolly fell ill and was diagnosed with brain cancer. On December 1st, Fr. Connolly was appointed pastor emeritus and Rev. Martin J. Dobrzynski was appointed

parish administrator and coadjutor pastor. On December 28, 2002, Fr. Connolly died. Fr. Marty became pastor upon Fr. Connolly's death. On January 1, 2003, parishioners, family and friends gathered for Fr. Connolly's wake. On January 2nd, Bishop Melczek presided at Fr. Connolly's funeral Mass. Both events were held in the church built under Fr. Connolly's leadership.
