From the Pastor's Desk

Signs of Love! One of the most crucial areas of preparation for young couples seeking the sacrament of marriage is communication. Some people might be surprised by this fact, thinking that the church's teachings about the marriage state or the spirituality of married life would be most important.

The simple fact is, that a couple that does not communicate well with each other on the deeper level of sharing their concerns and feelings about themselves as well as their future spouse will find themselves in a relationship that struggles to grow. A couple that expresses their love for each other in words and those obvious actions of love (like the giving of flowers) without the giving of their deeper selves to each other will soon find their relationship in jeopardy. The same holds true of our relationship with Jesus. If we do not take the time to speak to our Lord in prayer, not just asking for His help but also praising Him for His continuous love and grace in our lives, our relationship will be strained and we begin to look for other things to fill the void.

Giving God a few seconds here and there can fool us into believing that just thinking about God from time to time is enough. To do the obvious expressions of love, like talk about how we love Jesus without offering our true concerns to the Lord about ourselves, our sinfulness, our weaknesses, and those ugly things we like to leave hidden will sooner or later leave us in a stale relationship with God.

When we bring our full self to Jesus we cannot help but see where we really need to seek His most powerful gift, His mercy. Those things that drive us apart from each other like our pride, our entitlement, our anger or envy are laid bare for us to realize. This happens when walking with Jesus is a purposeful journey. These attitudes of pride, anger, entitlement, etc. are powerful. These powerful attitudes can only be checked and reconciliation (which is God's gift to us to be used by us to reconcile ourselves to one another) can only happen when we lay these attitudes at His feet. This is not the "gift" we like to give to Jesus, but we must if we are to be healed of the blindness that these attitudes foment.

The need for contemplation that is, sitting in silence without Facebook, Snapchat, TV or radio; simply waiting on God is a must for every Christian. Not even words are needed. God hears our sighs and acknowledges our tears. God already knows what we want, how can we know what God wants when we don't give ourselves time to listen. One sure sign of our love for God is the time you and I spend with God opening up the deepness of our hearts to God and being open to God communicating with us.

At Mass, we give some example of this need for silence. The silence between the Scripture readings and after communion is not a "waste of time." It is time for you and me to direct our thoughts to what we have just heard or the great Gift we have just received. This is uncomfortable to some people, so accustomed are we to one type of noise or another filling every moment of our day. Silence gives us a chance to do more than just think but to reflect, to give ourselves time to let the Spirit speak to each of us in our hearts.

Our Lord wants to shower His healing love deep into the ruptures of our lives. He seeks to reconcile us to one another and to the Father. Jesus wants to remove the blindness exacerbated by the troubles experienced by us all over the last several years. Indeed, He makes our reconciliation with the Father contingent on our willingness to seek reconciliation with others. Turn your impatience, pride, anger, etc. over to Jesus in regular daily prayer; He is the only True Hope through which you and I can enter into a more peace-filled life, rooted in the great gift of God's reconciling love.
