The diocese requires that arrangements must be made at least six months in advance of the wedding date in order for the proper personal, spiritual and liturgical preparations of the couple to be completed.

From the Pastor's Desk

Daily Devotions? Daily life can be, for many, a grind. Taking the kids to and from one activity to another, washing clothes, and rising in the dark to go to work only to return in the dark even though it's 4:30 in the afternoon is tough. It certainly takes its toll on the human heart. Marriages creak and strain, some break, under this "rat race" of life. Friendships can be fleeting and hard to maintain. But for all the activity we find ourselves engaged in between family, school, sports and work, we can still be very lonely people.

Interest in matters "spiritual" continues to grow among all the segments of society, yet, we still are missing something. Years ago people had devotions, special prayers and religious activities that brought balance to their lives. Devotion is not dead; some people put this same passion into following a vegetarian diet or exercise or sports. Modern devotion has less to do with God and more to do with me. The consequence of this is "new" devotional emphasis on me or my "passions" is that I lose sight of God and in the end, lose sight of others. Consequently, my non-religious devotions become just part of the grind of daily life, too.

To have devotion is to put your whole self into the task at hand. To be devoted to God is not merely a statement about who you are but one about what you do daily. We cannot love God in private. God's love affair with us is not private. To love God is a public stance that anticipates our acting on that devotion. That "love your neighbor" stuff, God meant it!

As the famous Russian author, Dostoevsky, so adeptly said "Love in practice is a hard and dreadful thing compared to love in dreams." It is important to know the difference between being in love with the idea of being loved and being in love with loving others. The first, is what society tells us is love, the love that "sweeps you off your feet." But this love is not the main show. The ultimate maturity is embracing love that does not always realize a return. To love, to care for others, even if they don't care for you is the love that has real power. This is the love that will change you and me and the world. This is the love that bristles at tribalism and challenges doctrinaire opinions that divide and destroy the pursuit of the common good.




How do we get there? Being devoted to spending time with Jesus in prayer is most essential. It doesn't have to be anything complicated, just 3 or 4 minutes in the morning asking for His help during the day, and 3 or 4 minutes at night reviewing the day with Jesus and seeing where you followed Him well and where you might need a bit more grace to do better tomorrow. Being devoted to seeking forgiveness in the Sacrament of Penance is needed so God's grace can help us to love more readily. It works only when you and I exercise our trust in God, not in ourselves. Trust has no time for rumors or self-centered motives, rather trust thrives when respect towards the other is honored. This is a daily journey that also involves every person we engage during the day, the week, the month, the year. The fruits of our devotion to God properly challenges our opinions, our hardened attitudes towards others who are different or think differently than we do. It leads us to see as God sees, not as human beings see.

Daily devotions directed toward God is the surest way to help your family stay devoted to one another. It is the surest way for you to stay devoted to the core values of respect for others and concern for the well being of others, even those you don't agree with at the moment. It is the surest way to enter into Jesus' Divine Heart that can heal all division and hatred that you or I might be tempted to entertain. Be first, devoted to God, then your family and then all the rest falls into place.
