

From the Associate Pastor's Desk -

Who Rules this World?

If an all-knowing, all-powerful and all-good God is the sovereign of the world, why is there so much unrest and suffering? This is perhaps the deepest question mankind can ponder. The answer requires a story and history lesson:

Recall from the book of Genesis that, after God had made all things, He created the lord of the earth—Adam. "Have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the air and over every living thing that moves upon the earth" (Gen 1:28). With these words, <u>God gave authority to Adam to rule the earth</u>.

Of course, Adam and Eve were not alone in the earthly paradise. A ferocious tyrant was lurking, one who had been expelled from his birthplace after a failed rebellion.

Imagine the scene: Adam, ruler of the world, now forced to contend with the dragon full of wrath at losing his seat in heaven. In the dragon's lust for lordship, he went after Adam's crown—dominion over the earth. To gain the throne, Satan would have to depose the current king. The conniving serpent tricked Adam into signing dominion of the world over to him by convincing Adam to sin against God, tempting him to see God as a rival, telling him to grasp for knowledge that would make him "like God." And when Adam fell for the gambit, he fell into slavery to the devil, and with him went the kingship. <u>After Adam's fall, Satan became the prince of this world</u>.

The devil ruled with an iron fist, and anyone who attempted to hear the voice of God and carry out God's will in Satan's kingdom was quickly attacked and snuffed out, preferably in the same, quiet way he took out Adam—by tempting him to sin against God. <u>The devil's attempt to parley with every human soul was surprisingly successful</u>: "Surrender to me, and I will give you whatever you want: pleasure, money, power—you name it. I will let you live in peace; I will not fight you or hurt you, if only you submit to me."

<u>There was one who would not submit, however</u>. The devil came to parley with him in the desert. The devil gave his juiciest offer yet: "I will give you all the kingdoms of the world, if only you worship me!" But this new Adam replied, "Begone Satan! You shall worship the Lord your God, and Him only shall you serve!" (Matt 4:10). At that, the two commanders parted, returning to their battle lines, ready for open confrontation. The stakes of this war were nothing less than dominion over the earth and the lives of all its denizens. The hour of battle took place one fateful Friday. To the horror of the dragon, none of the tortures he inflicted upon this new Adam bent his will. And after Adam's body collapsed lifeless to the ground, the dragon's rage only increased. Here was one he could not corrupt. Here was one who was obedient to the true Sovereign. The dragon could not wrest dominion away from this new Adam, from this Jesus of Nazareth.

God then raised Jesus to eternal life and granted Him dominion over the world. The dragon still lives, but he has become a slave to Jesus. Anything we see as "bad" in this world is permitted by Jesus so that He might further humiliate the devil and increase the glory of God when He comes to save, heal, restore and protect. Jesus Christ is King of the Universe, and at His name all knees in heaven, on the earth, and under the earth will bend! (cf. Phil 2:10)
