From the Associate Pastor's Desk -

Come Lord—Our Justice!

About one month ago we celebrated All Souls Day, a day where we pray for every human person who has died. On this day, there is a traditional song we sing for our dearly departed. It's called the *Dies Irae* in Latin, which translated means "The Day of Wrath." (If you haven't gotten it yet, we Christians are strange people—we put our feet in heaven and say everyone else is standing upside-down). Yes, that's right: on a day when we're mourning the loss of grandma, we hear about the fear and trembling of the Day of Judgment when God will dissolve the world in fire, raise the dead out of the ashes, and judge everyone according to his or her deeds.

What does this have to do with Advent? Well, as I said, we, Christians are strange people. <u>During Advent, we call on God to hasten the Day of Judgment, the Second Coming of Jesus Christ</u>. "Come Lord Jesus, Judge of the earth! Destroy the world with heavenly fire! Set everything ablaze—let none escape!" Really cheery stuff to be praying before Christmas. Nothing says "Seasons Greetings" like fire and brimstone.

The reason we Christians have the audacity to make such prayers is because God's wrath is not meant for us. God prepared the lake of fire for the devil and his angels (Matt 25:41; Rev 20:14-15). What God prepared for us human beings is the kingdom of God (Matt 25:34).


Imagine that you commit a crime. You are arrested and brought to court. The accusing party demands that you receive the death sentence for your crime. The adversarial lawyer presents a beautifully worded brief, during which *even you* begin to believe that he's right—your crime is so heinous, how can you be allowed to live? You turn to your lawyer and tell him your thoughts to deny the charges, to plead innocent; how else can you escape the horrid death penalty if you are found guilty? Your advocate, however, tells you not to worry, that you won't die, that he'll present his brief and convince the judge to lighten the sentence. "But," he notes, "if you attempt to deny the charges, there's not much I can do for you. Come clean, and trust in my ability to soften the judge's heart. After all, the Lord Justice is the one judging this case, not your adversary."

For millennia, people of faith have seen our human situation like a court trial. The name Satan means "Adversary" or "Accuser," for he seeks our condemnation. The Holy Spirit is called the "Advocate" or the "Paraclete," for he is the one who stands beside us to defend our case (cf. John 16:7). Jesus Himself is declared to be the Judge of the world, able to judge fairly because He became man. The psalmists cried out to God, asking deliverance from enemies who falsely accuse; they appealed to God's justice and His law. The legal analogy is not new.

We Christians have courage in the Final Judgment because our accuser is a liar and the father of lies, and our advocate is God Himself. Moreover, the judge is Jesus Christ, who already suffered our punishment for sin, that we might accept His offer of mercy and change our ways. The court is stacked in our favor, so we have confidence that the day of trial will be the day of our vindication.

We call judges of the highest courts "Justices" because their word of sentence *becomes* justice; there is no further chance for appeal, no chance to be accused again. We look forward to the day that we stand before Jesus and say, "Behold the Lord, our Justice!" For then we will be at peace, and the accuser silenced. God's Word is Justice. May He come swiftly and bring an end to our trials!
