

Marriage....The bride, groom or their parents/grandparents must be active registered members of the parish for at least one year prior to reserving a date for the wedding. The diocese requires that arrangements must be made at least six months in advance of the wedding date in order for the proper personal, spiritual and liturgical preparations of the couple to be completed.

From the Pastor's Desk

To Be the Font of God's Love. The mission of the family is to be the font or most direct conduit to God's love. Sadly, in recent society, some movements have targeted the family in its most natural state of father, mother, children and extended family of grandparents, etc. as "not functional." These movements tout "equality" in all things including the dismantling of the family unit in favor of "gender confusion" and "social families." This is not new. It has been a modern problem since the late 1800's. Destruction of the family has been attempted in various communist regimes in the last century. In this country, it was realized in an embrace of eugenics, (aka abortion rights) which has not died the death it should have.

The Church puts the spotlight on the family because we have convinced ourselves that we can re-invent the family. A driving force in this re-creation is our distorted sense of individuality. The splintering of family groups, justified because one person or the other needs to be "free" or be "themselves," denies the natural human contentedness between persons. This natural communal bond is meant to help us grow, to challenge us to look beyond our tendency to be self-centered, to be other-centered.

Today's feast originated at the turn of the last century, 1893. The western world at that time was more and more tempted to treat the family as simply a social construct, nothing more. This feast reminds us that the family unit is not ordained by man as a convenient social construct that can be re-constructed in our own image. Rather, it is an institution that is natural and for the purpose of love; love in the pattern and image of God who constitutes the human family. This love is not self-centered, but other-centered, as both mother and father work out their difficulties together to grow in love with each other and thus show their children what love all about.

This, sadly, is considered offensive to some. The Holy Family is holy not because the son is the Son of God, but because they, who did not know the full extent of Jesus' Divine nature, were open to each other and to God. They sought the good of the other: Joseph looking out for the good of Mary and the Child, Mary caring for her Son, even when it meant giving Him up, Jesus caring for them both not just in the necessities of this life but in giving of Himself for them and us for life eternal. This pattern of self-giving love is holy because it reflects God's Love.

It is not beyond us. It does take some discipline on our part: a willingness to curb our individualistic tendencies that ignore the good of the other, a willingness to grow, even when it hurts. In order for the family to be fully alive, love must be its mission, not passing love, but heroic love.

Our families might not be as perfect as a marketing agent would see it; Dad, Mom, two and half kids and a dog, but they can be perfect if we grow in how to love as Jesus teaches us. More marriages would be healed, more children would know the security of relationships and more good would be accomplished in and out of the home if God is at the center. But when "I" am at the center, "we" cannot survive. It is not easy in a world that constantly tells me that "I" am the most important person. Yet, the results of this pursuit of the "I" is evident in increased depression, developmental issues, educational problems and a general sense of despair.

The family of Jesus, large and extended, as the Gospel relates, shows us another way; a way that even modern day studies affirm. When married people work through their marriage, solve their problems and look out for the other, they have happier children and in the end have a more satisfying life. They lower their risk for heart disease and depression. The grass is not greener on the other side of the fence.

Someone Getting Married? It is at this time of the year and in the month ahead that many young people get engaged. If you are getting engaged, please remember that you need to contact the parish office no less than six months in advance of your wedding date. If you have a friend or a family member that is Catholic, you can help them by reminding them of this important fact too. Contacting the parish office nine months in advance is best. Deacons Ron and Gary, Fr. Robert and I are charged with the responsibility to help couples prepare for the Sacrament of Marriage. This preparation is bolstered by other married couples in the parish and it takes time. The six months is needed. We want to help you have a successful and happy marriage, not just a nice wedding day.

Blessings of Homes. It is customary to bless the homes of parishioners during the Christmas Season. If you wish your home to be blessed, please contact the main office, 322-4505, ext. 0. FYI: Obviously daytime appointments are more numerous than evening appointments.






