

From the Pastor's Desk

From time to time I run across the reflections from other priests that I think are good to pass along. Below is one of those reflections from Fr. Blaney who is the founder and President of Sharing Meadows, a ministry for adults with special needs.



As we prepare for Thanksgiving Day, we should look at the way the world is going.

In the past, Hitler developed the idea that there was a super race and the lesser people should be eliminated! This included especially Jewish people, everyone remembers. But there were other groups who were routinely eliminated, namely the handicapped!

In the United States of America, 90% of babies who are, through amniocentesis, discovered to have Down Syndrome, are eliminated through abortion. In Iceland and Denmark, there are no more babies being born with Down Syndrome. They are all aborted. In China, there is a rule—only one child per family and of course, if there is a child with a handicapping condition, the baby is aborted.

Abortion is now a big business in America. The abortion clinics claim to be health centers for women. But did you know that, if the unborn baby is discovered to be female, that baby is sometimes aborted for the sole reason of it being an unwanted female? What about young girls who have abortions when their babies were the result of sexual abuse. And the abortion clinics, against the law, never report to the authorities the sexual abuser, allowing the sexual abuse to continue.

Sadly, Hitler's idea of eliminating the less than perfect is still active in this world. Here at Sharing Meadows, the other abled are recognized as an important part of society as God made them. They have the ability of trying to love each person. That is why people visiting Sharing Meadows recognize its peacefulness!

At Sharing Meadows we have a guest house. Young parents of other abled persons often go through a very negative time with people commenting that their other abled child will not learn to drive, go to college, get a self-sustaining job etc. etc. We would love to have you spend a day out here working along with our villagers and seeing their good qualities, having a meal in one of the homes and experiencing the joy of our community. And if you have received news from your amniocenteses that your baby has Down Syndrome, before you make any decisions, come out here to visit and stay in our guest house to see the value and happiness of a Down Syndrome individual.

Sharing Good Thoughts and Experiences. Our students, parents, and teachers have so much love and enthusiasm for our school that they want to share their experiences. Lower Your Taxes and Help the Children at St. Michael School

If a business or individual donates \$1000, they will receive a \$500 tax credit on their Indiana State income taxes. You can also use this same donation as an itemized tax deduction for your federal income taxes. It is truly a win-win situation. You can lower your taxes while helping the children at St. Michael School. This tax credit program is only available while state funding is available. In recent years, the tax credit program was only available through mid-December. The bottom line is to make your donation as early as possible to take advantage of this tax saving program. 


