From the Pastor's Desk

Fruitful Surrender? Today's Gospel is the final story in a trilogy of salvation. The woman at the well, who comes to know Jesus as her savior, longs to drink the "living" water Jesus can only provide. This water is used both to wash us clean and to quench our thirst so that the allurements of the world, that promise to quench our thirst, can be shown for what they are -- lies.

This is the same water used in last week's Gospel to wash the clay from Bartimaeus' eyes. He was the man born blind, like all of us. In the second installment of this trilogy we learn how to thirst with our eyes. How to long to see as Christ sees. In that story we are reminded how not to take our faith for granted, because we could easily also be the many characters in that same story who Jesus calls blind. To see with one's soul is to thirst for the living water that is Christ. This is where the third installment begins.

The main characters in today's gospel are both people who know Jesus as a friend and also know him as a great preacher and healer. But they do not yet acclaim him as the "Son of God" the "Christ." Today's story teaches us the logical conclusion for those who follow Jesus. To know Jesus, to drink his living water like Mary, see him for more than just a special man like Martha is to proclaim him for what he is, "the resurrection and the life." Both Martha and Mary have to make the last leap in the midst of sorrow and pain.

The woman at the well makes the leap in the midst of the excitement of discovery, "come see a man who told me everything about me, might he be the Messiah?" The man born blind came to make his leap from a powerful sense of thankfulness for new sight, both physical and spiritual. But Martha and Mary make the most profound leap, for it is out of helplessness and sorrow that they are asked to profess their faith.

You and I often fall into the temptation to want to approach God from our strength. We could sum it up in good sentiments like, "If I win the lottery, I'll take care of the church, the poor, or some worthy charity." This is a nice thought but it is one that says, out of my strength I'll do something. Or sometimes it is expressed in terms of time, like, "When I retire, when the kids are grown, when I get older, when I (you can fill in the blank) I will help with the Good Samaritans, or join the choir, or do (whatever). This too is to fall into the temptation that such surrender to God is meant to be on my terms.

Martha, who liked to have things just so, and Mary, who listened to Jesus teaching with great devotion both had to learn how to "give it over" to Jesus by way of sorrow, vulnerability and pain. In a sense, this story prepares us for what Jesus himself does on the cross. For it is out of these attitudes, or better, realities that he must surrender to the Father on our behalf.

We have plenty of opportunities to "give it over" to God. The most fruitful surrender though is not out of strength but out of vulnerability. Because, like Martha and Mary, we then have the possibility, indeed the promise, we will see new life, new hope, new horizons that help to better see God daily and satisfy our thirst for his loving embrace.

Preparing for the Great Week. God is clear that he desires most of all "a humble and contrite heart." That is, a willingness on our part to come to him and seek his forgiveness and mercy, especially in the Sacrament of Penance. Your preparation and mine involves a review of our conscience. This review is most useful when it digs deep to uncover those attitudes which lead us to hurt ourselves and others.

The key question to use in your review of conscience is WHY? Why do I lose my temper so quickly, what does God need to heal in me to help me with this? Why do I treat others with disdain, what part of me is disdainful even to myself? Why can't I show mercy to others, the poor or family members whom I don't like? Do I accept God's mercy for me or is my indifference or callousness a sign of how I ignore God's mercy for me?

Prepare yourself by giving some thought to those attitudes that lead you to walk in the opposite direction of God's love. What are those more hidden habits of the heart directing your actions that offend others and so offend God? Then as we gather this Tuesday, March 20th, at 6:30 PM bring those things that need God's healing love to the Sacrament of God's forgiveness.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

The Rites of Scrutiny are meant to uncover, and then heal, all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the Elect as well as ourselves and to bring out through repentance all that is upright, strong, and good. Three Scrutinies were celebrated in the parish community on the 3rd, 4th, and

5th Sundays of Lent after the homily. *The Elect* is *Mariano Vlcek*. Please keep them in your prayers as he prepares for the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil. *RCIA* is the process for those who are over the age of 8, baptized in another faith tradition, non-baptized, or only baptized in the Catholic faith and wish to complete their sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist.

Fifth Sunday of Lent-So Dead

Need Assistance with Tuition?

Diocese of Gary tuition assistance applications for the 2018/19 school year are available only online at the Diocesan website, www.dcgary.org. You will find the application by clicking on the Schools tab and then clicking on the blue rectangle labeled Tuition Assistance Application. There are no paper applications. The regular application period will close tomorrow, March 19, 2018. After that date, families must wait for initial awards to be distributed before the application will open again sometime in June for late applications, appeals, and new families.

Tuition assistance is only open to Catholic families who are registered members of parishes within the Diocese of Gary. You may complete an application if you have children entering grades kindergarten through twelve. Pre-school students are not eligible for tuition assistance. There is a \$27 fee per family to apply. If you need help with the application, FACTS will have an e-mail address, phone number, and chat line on the application website for customer service.
