
From the Pastor's Desk

Ready for Tomorrow? Live Today Well. Over the past few weeks, the second reading at Sunday Mass has been taken from Paul's letter to the Ephesians. In the portion of the letter we are reading, St. Paul has been providing an ongoing instruction on what it means to live and share God's life not in the future but in the here and now. Now we might think that what St. Paul had to say nearly 2000 years ago probably doesn't apply to us. After all, we are more advanced. We have the internet, we have better plumbing, and we could go on. Yet, like in St. Paul's day, we still have people who suffer malnutrition, our world suffers from our overuse of natural resources, and we are all affected by our selfish attitudes which lead to indulging our passions in food, drink, drugs and extramarital affairs. Though our external world might appear to be too advanced for St. Paul, our internal world is still a mess.

It is our internal world that builds society. Society is not a collection of buildings and technology. Our internal lives (our dreams, fears, driving philosophy, anxiety, etc.) build society for the good and for the worse. A just society is not one that has better i-phones, or taller buildings, or even one that takes the approach of "you do your thing and leave me alone for me to do my thing." Indeed, the Roman society of Paul's day had the best communication network of the day, the biggest buildings of the age and a similar laissez-faire attitude. It was a society at odds with Christ's message. Today we might not feed Christians to the lions but society discounts the Gospel message as much today as it did back in the first century.

Our society pressures us to look out for ourselves, to take the best advantage we can, often without giving much thought to the other person, especially the unborn, the handicapped and the elderly. St. Paul also urges us to take the best advantage we can, but with constant regard for the other person. He wants us to be wise to the ways of this world. He wants us to use what we are given here to point out God's presence in this world and so prepare ourselves to be with Him in the end. One way to begin is by giving thanks to God "always and for everything," Paul tells us. An attitude of gratitude helps us to move beyond our passions, to allow us to see truly all that has been gifted to us. Even when, and particularly when, times get rough, we need to remind ourselves that we possess everything. How? Because we are possessed by God. If you and I belong to God then nothing in this world in the end can make us better off.

But we often lose sight of this greatest truth. I have been given everything I need in order to be the best person God intends me to be. Being open to God's will daily is the way I discover what God has planned for me. Society tells us "Do it your way." Doing it my way, I will get limited results, for I am a limited person. Doing it God's way will benefit me unlimited results because God is without limits. St. Paul would have seen wisdom in the musings of the philosopher, Camus, who reflected: I would rather live my life believing that there is a God before whom I will stand and then find out, when I die, there is no God; than live my life believing that there is no God only to find out too late that there is a God.




