From the Pastor's Desk

Love is the root and the end. When Jesus walked this earth in the flesh, His religion had developed those first commandments of ten into a myriad of laws that instructed the believer how to follow the original ten commands set down by God. Now this was helpful, but it became over time a hindrance to the whole point of the law which was to be holy as God is holy. People began to worry about small portions of the larger law missing the point of the original command given through Moses. This led to judgments being laid upon people that were far from the original intent of God, the primary law giver.

It is exactly this behavior that Jesus confronts in today's gospel story. The disciples are doing God's will and need to be nourished but what the Pharisees (who were scholars of the law) see is an obscure violation of the commandment to keep holy the Sabbath. The disciples were working, rolling the ears of grain between their palms to break it open and eat the fruit of the kernel. What the disciples were doing was technically work but the judgment of the Pharisees does not take into account the very important work they were doing with Jesus. Thus, a small detail in the law overtakes the overall good that the original commandment intended to protect. That good is to set aside this one day, the Sabbath, to do God honor, to turn your pursuits that day towards God. This is exactly what the disciples were doing with Jesus.

As Americans we pride ourselves on being law abiding citizens. How often we have heard that we are a nation governed by the "rule of law." Indeed, this is even the argument used by some politicians who, personally opposed to abortion, nonetheless support it because it is the "law of the land."

Being governed by the "rule of law" is certainly better than lawlessness. But when the LAW becomes the object of veneration, we forget that those laws are the result of our limited human experience. For a Christian, it is important to remember that we who write the laws (our politicians do it for us) are deeply affected by our own lawlessness; our inability to be obedient to God's basic laws of forgiveness, justice and respect for life in all its stages.

The laws we devise are always flawed and though they order our common life they need not be worshipped as if they came down from heaven on stone tablets. Those true laws, or commands, given to us by God through Moses must always be the basis of our laws today. When the fleeting value of individualism takes precedence over the common good or over another powerless individual then the law, no matter how popular, is flawed.

The original commands of God were set down to help His people to know their boundaries; do not covet, respect life, do not murder, do not defame or slander, honor your God and those who He places over you, your parents, honor your neighbor's marriage, etc. These are set down to help the people to live in harmony and be close to their Creator. These commands, and Jesus' perfection of them in the Law of Love (love God and love your neighbor as yourself), must always guide any just law if happiness is to be truly pursued.



Twenty Second Sunday in Ordinary Time Stewardship: A Way of Life

HEARING AND DOING

It is made clear throughout the Gospels and Epistles that our discipleship, as followers of Jesus, is not over until our bodily death. In today's second reading we are urged, "Be doers of the word and not hearers only" (James 1:22). Discipleship is hard. Sometimes we have "reasons" why we cannot do things—we are too tired, too old, too sick, too needy. We are too busy with work, with children, with other responsibilities. Yet some of the best "prayers" are people confined by illness or disability. Some of the wisest listeners are the elderly, who have a lifetime of patience and wisdom to draw on. Some of the most generous givers are those who have endured poverty and suffering themselves. Some of the most admired organizers are those who delegate and let other people shine. And let us not forget the heroes who put their lives on the line in time of crisis. Not everyone is called to heroism, but all of us are called to live generously and selflessly. The opportunities are endless: in our families, our parish, our neighborhood or town, and in places around the world. Try to balance prayer, action and financial giving. A busy mother with three toddlers can hardly spend hours in prayer or at church. A man who must work two jobs to support his family has limited time to volunteer, and a person on a tiny fixed income cannot give large donations to the church or charity. However, the busy mother can talk to God as she chases after her little ones. The hardworking man can help with an occasional parish event, and the person with a limited income can put a steady few dollars in the collection each week. Everyone can be a "doer."
