

From the Pastor's Desk

What Really Counts? How do I count the days of my life? Do I count how much money I make? Do I add up the pleasures I feel? Do I keep track of the power I have acquired? Do I simply move from one year to the next counting birthdays?

God longs to teach us how to count our days. The scripture is clear on this point. Real wisdom comes in counting each new dawn not as a chance to make more, spend more, or indulge more but as an opportunity to



find God's kindness in others and in my own actions. Each day is filled with many blessings if we but adjust our vision. Indeed, even our work, no matter if that is at home, in school, the factory or the office, is a daily participation in God's divine life.

It is only when we rejoice in each moment of the life that God has given us that we can understand the commandments of the Lord recounted in the gospel today. First and foremost, "You shall not kill." Indeed most of the commandments can be summed up in this one. For to envy, covet, gossip, be unfaithful, deny God respect, dishonor our parents are all forms of killing. Certainly, to treat our own bodies as if they were not of God, indulging in behaviors (our passions) which destroy our spirit even though they promise us fulfillment, is to kill. In a way it is like suicide.

When we do something over and over again we are trained. This is the premise for training our young how to eat, dress, and clean themselves. Training does not stop with these normal habits. We are trained how to think, and reason and how to judge the right from the wrong by many images and words which are often at odds with each other. Games have been used for ages to help train young people, like the game of "LIFE" or the game of "Monopoly" or even a game of tic-tac-toe. Games played over and over have an impact on us. Gaming with the up close and personal experience of killing another, as some very popular video games do, cannot certainly help us, especially our young people, to appreciate life. Remember, what gets heard or seen the most usually wins out.

The "culture of death" that St. Pope John Paul II so accurately pointed out to us trains us, young and old, by desensitizing us to death; not just physical death but the death of our true freedom and spirit too. Respect is lost for others, for their worth, and consequently it is lost upon ourselves thus allowing the excuse to behave in any way that is most pleasing to my passions. Our very entertainment, gaming, movies, TV shows and music, makes us so accustomed to death that it is not odd that our society passively condones or even supports killing the innocent, the unborn, the infirmed, the unwanted or even the guilty. It simply becomes just another "reasoned" decision to my own advantage.

Though the child in the womb is not convenient, you shall not kill. Though the scan shows the possibility of handicap, you shall not kill. Though the old man is sick and shares in Christ's pain, you shall not kill. Though some may look to end it all and seek our help and approval, you shall not kill. Though the convicted man has killed, you shall not kill. The command is clear, there is no room for ambiguity.

What counts? Living a life every day that seeks to promote LIFE by seeking God's blessings and passing them on. Passing on life not death, that is what counts. Pursuing the words and images that train us to see life and sifting out those images and words that lead us down the path of death. This is a purposeful action on our part. Decide to watch and listen to those things that point you closer to the God of life. Decide everyday for life, don't throw away what God has given.

Steps and Stages in the process of Christian Initiation

There are 4 stages in the process of becoming a Catholic. The first is the "Period of Evangelization and Precatechumenate." In this informal time, someone who is thinking about becoming a Catholic can ask questions and be introduced to the Gospel. In the second stage, the "Period of the Catechumenate," the person enters into a formal relationship with the Church, becoming a "catechumen" or listener. It is a time of nurturing and deepening faith in Christ. The third stage, the Period of Purification and Enlightenment" corresponds to the season of Lent. The catechumen-now counted among the "elect" enters into a time of intense prayer and preparation for the Easter sacraments. Following the Initiation Sacraments at the Easter Vigil, the new initiates enter the "Period of Postbaptismal Catechesis or Mystagogy," reflecting on the life-changing sacraments received at the Easter Vigil.




Art & Environment Meeting

Last year, the tax credit program was only available through late March. The bottom line is to make your donation as early as possible to take advantage of this tax saving program. Fall Prevention

One in four older Americans falls every year. Falls are the leading cause of both fatal and nonfatal injuries for people aged 65+. Resulting in hip fractures, broken bones, and head injuries. Falls without a major injury can cause an older adult to become fearful or depressed, making it difficult for them to stay active. Helping older adults to reduce their risk of falling is a great way to help them stay healthy and independent as long as possible. Most falls can be prevented. The key is to know where to look.

- Balance and gait: As we age, most of us lose some coordination, flexibility, and balance
- Vision: Less light reaches the retina; contrasting edges, tripping hazards, and obstacles harder to see.
- **Medications:** Some prescriptions and over-the-counter medications can cause dizziness, dehydration or interactions with each other that can lead to a fall.
- **Environment:** Most seniors have lived in their homes for a long time; simple modifications in the home can keep it safer as they age.
- Chronic conditions: More than 80% of older adults have at least one chronic condition. These can increase the risk of falling because they result in lost function, inactivity, depression, pain, or multiple medications. *Health and Spirituality Committee*







Construction Corner: Saint Michael Church Renovation

After last week's Mass, you may have noticed that renovation of our church's interior has commenced.
