


From the Pastor's Desk

DAILY DEVOTIONS. Daily life can be, for many, a grind. Taking the kids to and from one activity to another, washing clothes, and rising in the dark to go to work only to return in the dark even though its 4:30 in the afternoon is tough. It certainly takes its toll on the human heart. Marriages creak and strain, some break, under this "rat race" of life. Friendships can be fleeting and hard to maintain. But for all the activity we find ourselves engaged in between family, school and work we are still very lonely people.

Interest in matters "spiritual" continues to grow among all the segments of society. We still are missing something. Years ago people had devotions, special prayers and religious activities that brought balance to their lives. Devotion is not dead; some people put this same passion into following a vegetarian diet. Modern devotion has less to do with God and more to do with me. And if our devotional energies center more on me, I lose sight of God and in the end lose sight of others. Consequently, my non-religious devotions becomes just part of the grind of daily life.

To have devotion is to put your whole self into the task at hand. To be devoted to God is not merely a statement about who you are but one about what you do, daily. We cannot love God in private. God's love affair with us is not private. To love God is a public stance that anticipates our acting on that devotion. That "love your neighbor" stuff, God meant it!



As the famous Russian author Dostoevsky so adeptly said "Love in practice is a hard and dreadful thing compared to love in dreams." It is important to know the difference between *being in love with the idea of being loved* and *being in love with loving others*. The first, is what society tells us is love, the love that "sweeps you off your feet." But this love is not the main show. The ultimate maturity is embracing love that does not always realize a return. To love, to care for others even if they don't care for you is the love that has real power. This is the love that will change you and me and the world. This is the love that bristles at tribalism and challenges doctrinaire opinions that divide and destroy the pursuit of the common good.

How do we get there? It is a daily journey that involves every person we engage during the day, the week, the month, the year. It challenges our opinions, our hardened attitudes towards others who are different or think differently than we do. A daily examination of our conscious is needed to keep us on the right path. Seeking forgiveness in the Sacrament of Penance is needed so God's grace can help us to love more readily. It also works only when trust is undertaken and underpins all we do. Because trust has no time for rumors or self-centered motives, rather trust thrives when respect towards the other is honored.



Haiti Update November 2018

There has been much activity behind the scenes, creating a plan for our Haiti Twinning Project, but also many people and groups continue to provide ways to assist our new friends in Notre Dame de la Merci parish.

- Labors of Love continues to sew pillowcase dresses for the young girls.
- The children's RCIA collected and donated two backpacks filled with school supplies.
- SMS sponsored a *Dress Down Day* in September which collected over \$1800 for school supplies.
- The Haiti steering committee met recently with Deacon Bob Larkin from Naperville who has been to Notre Dame de la Merci many times. He provided some very good information about the water quality in Jacquesyl. Since the town is very close to the sea, the well located near the church will turn brackish by late morning. There are several solutions which will be evaluated in the coming weeks.
- A few weeks ago I attended a conference in Lafayette which was attended by many other churches in our state that are twinning with parishes in Haiti. I learned a lot of hygiene, sanitation, water purification options in Haiti. I was impressed that so many people in our own backyard have been working with parishes in Haiti for more than 15 years. But we are the first diocese to develop twinning with parishes in the northeast diocese of Fort Liberte.

Beginning the week before Thanksgiving, we will be partnering wit Haiti Marycare, and offering an opportunity for parishioners, families, or ministries to provide a school scholarship for a child in Notre Dame de la Merci school. For \$150 per year, you can sponsor a child for one year in school which provides for tuition, uniform, supplies and one meal a day. A great bargain for such an important cause!

The steering committee will be visiting Jacquesyl in late January, on a short fact-finding mission. Fr. Gregory and our principal, Colleen Kennedy, and I and perhaps others will be visiting with Fr. Franz to continue developing our relationship. I am sure we will come back with lots of ways to help. If anyone else would like to join the steering committee please contact me.

Wow, much is happening. Thank you for all the support for our friends in Jacquesyl, Haiti! Watch for more information and activities in the coming weeks! May God continue to bless our efforts to help the less fortunate people in the world. *Deacon Ron*
