From the Pastor's Desk


Show Me the Money! A catch phrase from the late 1990's, "Show me the money" expresses our need to be convinced before we commit. There are those who would claim this to be a natural state for human beings. We don't want to give until we know what we are going to get. If this is our natural tendency, I would argue that it does not come from God but from our *Fall*, the sin of our first parents.

The "show me the money" sentiment is one of distrust; distrust that if I put in I might not receive my share. The problem with this approach is that nothing happens. If everyone feels this way we come to a stand still.

When we apply this philosophy to our relationship with God or with His Church (for the Church is Christ present in the world) then we have an even bigger problem. Because God has already "shown us the money"

as it were. By holding back our participation either spiritually, or as one who is called to minister as a disciple, or financially is to say to God that "you have not done enough for me so I am unwilling to do for you. I will not do anything for you until you do something for me." This is a problem because this is simply false thinking. God has given us Christ. He has given us the Church as His continued Presence in our midst through which we are nourished with the Body and Blood of Christ. He offers us the "Way" to contentment in this life and eternal happiness in the next.

The story of the widow of Zarephath from the 1st book of Kings shows us the attitude we need to adopt. God sends the prophet, Elijah, specifically to this very poor woman to seek her hospitality. She, by all accounts, could not afford to be hospitable. Indeed, she at first politely protests his expectations that she should provide some food and drink for him. Elijah does not console her by promising that she will have plenty to eat in the future if she waits on him. No, he simply tells her those power-



ful words "Do not be afraid." These are the same words Jesus speaks to the disciples and to us. This is all he says and then directs her to make him a small hearth cake before she mixes the last of her ingredients into her final meal.

She takes his advice and proceeds without fear. There is no miracle that she seeks before she acts. She doesn't say "show me the money." After she prepares the food and sends the prophet on his way, as she prepares for her certain death by starvation, suddenly her jug of oil replenishes itself and the flour bag grows fat again. The miracle happens only after she gives, not before.

This is a powerful lesson for us all who fall into the trap of "show me the money." In a society that seeks first its own needs, the widow of Zarephath stands as our judge. Let us take her lesson to heart because God still works the same way as He did then.

Tips About Staying Healthy

As the temperature starts to drop and we enter the fall/winter season, the cough, cold and flu season is soon to follow. Here are three top tips for protecting yourself and your family from viral illnesses this winter season. 1. Hand Hygiene – so simple and relatively inexpensive. Keeping hands clean through improved hand hygiene is one of the most important steps we can take to avoid getting sick and spreading germs to others. Hand hygiene can be performed in a number of ways: hand washing with non-antimicrobial soap and water, alcohol-based hand rub, or antiseptic hand wash after having contact with respiratory secretions and/or con-taminated objects/materials. A couple years ago ABC News conducted a study – "Which Contains Germs Better - Tissue or Elbow? The findings were if you had a tissue – by covering your nose and mouth there was very little chance of spreading germs. Of course, however, if you feel that sneeze coming on and you don't have a tissue, sneeze into your elbow.

2. Get a flu shot – it's not just for the elderly. In fact, everyone 6 months and older is recommended for annual flu vaccination with rare exception. While there are many different flu viruses, a flu vaccine protects against the viruses that research suggests will be most common. Flu vaccination can also reduce flu illnesses, doctors' visits, and missed work and school due to flu, as well as prevent flu-related hospitalizations.

3. Get Smart About Antibiotics—the number of antibiotics that are being developed by drug manufacturers every year is declining and overuse and misuse of the antibiotics currently available for treatment are becoming less effective for treating increasing rates of resistant bacteria. Avoid asking for antibiotics for treatment of viral illness. At least 30% of antibiotic courses prescribed in the outpatient setting are unnecessary, meaning that no antibiotic is needed at all. Most of this unnecessary use is for acute respiratory conditions, such as colds, bronchitis, sore throats caused by viruses, and even some sinus and ear infections. Focus on supportive care of viral illness and stock up on pain relievers, cough and cold medications, cough drops, and any other home remedies that can help you and your loved one through the toughest days of a viral illness.



Campus Corner

Happy Fall everyone! First, I would like to let everyone know what happened this summer with the HVAC system. As I'm sure you were aware, we had some issues with the A/C this summer. When it was first diagnosed, we were told that we had a major failure of a key component of the system and that it would be a major undertaking and expense to get it repaired and/or possibly replaced. As it turned out, and with a second opinion from a HVAC engineering firm, it was not as catastrophic as first reported. What happened was that several sensors and other components failed at the same time (apparently not uncommon for a 20 year old system) and together produced error codes leading to the wrong conclusion. After correcting these issues at a significantly reduced cost as first suggested, I am happy to report that all is fine and operating correctly. A preventative maintenance program has been put in place to avoid some of these issues in the future. Thank you all for your patience and understanding.
