

From the Pastor's Desk

The right attitude. To get ahead in the business world you need the right attitude. Following the company's "mission statement" is essential to moving up the corporate ladder. The same is true of school, sports, and making friends. The right attitude goes a long way.

Jesus lays down some basic attitudes that you and I, His followers, are called to live. These attitudes towards the world and our place in God's world are the "mission statement" Jesus lays out for His friends.

We are generally used to hearing Matthew's version of the Beatitudes. The presentation of these in Luke's gospel is far more direct. Many scholars believe that Luke's version is truer to the original as presented by Jesus. Why Matthew seems to soften Jesus' words is a discussion for another time. Luke, on the other hand, is writing his gospel story for a community that tends to be better-off. Consequently, the need to make it clear to his readers that by not following these attitudes set down by the Lord, they choose to suffer the

What Jesus gives us is our "Mission Statement." The consequence of not following the mission statement is quite grave. But these consequences are not put upon us by God; rather, you and I bring them on ourselves. The attitudes in today's Gospel and their opposites remind us of the old saying "what goes around, comes around." This is not a threat. It is a simple fact, that in failing to do good you and I participate in its opposite. This is a sobering thought, and it is meant to be one.

"anti-attitudes" attached to each of the positive attitudes.

For Jesus there is no neutral ground. Failure to pursue good is compliance with its opposite, evil. This is true in our private lives and in our public life. Failure to assist the poor is compliance with poverty and all its negative effects. The wish to remain neutral or conveniently uninformed about issues surrounding the moral obligation to support life is compliance with those who scoff at such an obligation and push an agenda that reduces human life to "feelings" of convenience and personal freedom.

Luke's presentation of the Beatitudes is meant to jolt the Christian out of complacency and self-serving motives that do not build up God's Kingdom. You and I cannot remain unaffected and unconcerned about the larger issues of our common humanity.

The good news to always remember is that Jesus is the one who helps us to step outside of our narrow concerns. It is God's Grace that enables you and me to live this mission statement as set down by Jesus.




Warrior of the Week

Saint of the Week

SAINT POLYCARP (69-155) February 23rd

On Feb. 23, the Catholic Church remembers the life and martyrdom of St. Polycarp, a disciple of the apostle and evangelist St. John. Polycarp is known to later generations primarily through the account of his martyrdom, rather than by a formal biography. However, it can be determined from that account that he was born around the year 69 AD. From the testimony he gave to his persecutors – stating he had served Christ for 86 years – it is clear that he was either raised as a Christian, or became one in his youth. Around the year 155, Polycarp became aware that government authorities were on the

lookout for him, seeking to stamp out the Catholic Church's claim of obeying a higher authority than the Emperor. He retreated to a country house and occupied himself with

constant prayer, before receiving a vision of his death that prompted him to inform his friends: "I must be burned alive." He changed locations, but was betrayed by a young man who knew his whereabouts and confessed under torture.

He was captured by two public officials, who urged him to submit to the state demands. "What harm is there," one asked, "in saying, 'Caesar is Lord,' and in sacrificing to him, with the other ceremonies observed on such occasions, so as to make sure of safety?"

"I shall not do as you advise me," he answered. Outraged by his response, the officials had him violently thrown from their chariot and taken to an arena for execution. Although the crowds clamored for Polycarp to be devoured by beasts, it was decided he should be burned alive, just as he had prophesied.

What happened next struck Polycarp's companions with amazement; they recorded the sight in the letter that they circulated after Polycarp's death.

"As the flame blazed forth in great fury," they wrote, "we to whom it was given to witness it, beheld a great miracle." The fire did not seem to touch the bishop's body. Rather, as they described, "shaping itself into the form of an arch, it encompassed – as by a circle – the body of the martyr. And he appeared within not like flesh which is burnt, but as bread that is baked, or as gold and silver glowing in a furnace."


"Moreover, we perceived such a sweet odor coming from the flames – as if frankincense or some such precious spices had been burning there."

The executioners perceived that Polycarp's death was not going as planned. Losing patience, they ordered him to be stabbed to death. From the resulting wound, "there came forth a dove, and a great quantity of blood, so that the fire was extinguished."

St. Polycarp has been venerated as a Saint since his death in 155.






Capital Campaign Totals as of February 8, 2019
