

From the Pastor's Desk

Fruits of the Spirit. Spring is here, though the colder weather has lessened its impact. Still, no doubt those among us who like to play in the dirt, weeding and planting, have been getting our hands dirty. The



most common vegetable planted during the last few weeks and in the weeks to come is the tomato. Even city gardeners plant tomatoes in clay pots with the hope, or better, the expectation of reaping a luscious harvest in 72 days.

A tomato plant that does not produce fruit is probably the most useless of plants. Indeed, I have not known many tomato vines that have not yielded fruit.

Today we celebrate the ancient harvest festival of Pentecost. Before Pentecost was associated with the coming of the Spirit it was celebrated as a harvest festival in Israel. The Christian dimension to this festival is also about harvests. The harvest from Jesus' act of love on the cross is the power of the Holy Spirit come to fullness in the world through the Church, you and me.

The Holy Spirit lives in us and gives us the ability to be fruitful. Bringing in a fruitful harvest is more than just saying the right prayers. The harvest

Jesus looks for has to be more abundant than reasonably expected. One tomato vine can produce more tomatoes than one or two people can reasonably eat. Because they produce so wonderfully, but, they also yield their harvest in such quantities that tomatoes have to be shared with friends, family and neighbors.

You and I are expected to produce in a likewise fashion. If we but allow it, the Holy Spirit in us can produce such a bounty of goodwill and peace that acts of kindness and charity, of generosity to the poor and towards the works of the Church, and of gentleness in our speech and actions will flow with no end in sight. Alleluia!

Everyone loves a parade, 'specially Jesus! On Sunday, June 23rd, we will celebrate the Feast of the Corpus Christi. It is a special day to show honor to our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament of His Body and Blood. A very traditional way of honoring a person is to have a parade. So that is what we are going to do after the 11:30 AM Mass. We call our parades "processions." We will process with the Blessed Sacrament outside the church through our cemetery, around Mount Calvary and back into the church. FIRST COMMUNICANTS are especially invited to dress in their First Communion clothes to help lead the procession. All of our prayerful labors are rewarded in the end with a wonderful lunch provided for all the "pilgrims" who walked with Jesus.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults How is the water used for Baptism different from ordinary water?

In the sacraments we use simple, earthly elements through which Christ gives us his grace. Water to be blessed for Baptism should be "pure and clean" and the font should be "spotlessly clean" (*Christian Initiation*, General Introduction, 18, 19). In cold climates water should be heated in preparation. The prayer of blessing for baptismal water recalls God's creation of all things in love and names the many Scripture stories about water. Finally it calls on the Father and Son to send the Holy Spirit down on the waters in the font. In the baptismal washing, water that may seem like ordinary water conveys the real presence and action of the Holy Trinity which



joins us to the Divine Persons forever. On reflection, our ordinary uses for water, such as cleansing, nourishment, or refreshment, take on new meaning: living baptismal water quenches our thirst for eternal life in Jesus Christ, who is our living water.





Stewardship: A Way of Life

CHOSEN, NOT PERFECT

As adults we can become solemn and even anxious about faith, taking ourselves much too seriously. We may think we have to be perfect before God can use us or make a home in our hearts. Today we remember Pentecost when, as promised, the power of the Holy Spirit was poured out onto the apostles. We do not have to be perfect for the Spirit to fill us. Remember this widely-distributed list of unlikely characters: Adam was a coward. Noah was a drunk. Sarah was too old. Isaac was a daydreamer. Jacob was a liar. Joseph was abused.
