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From the Pastor's Desk

Discipline? What most of us remember from being disciplined in our younger years is generally unpleasant. Yet, discipline is not limited to or even motivated by rendering punishment. It is true that at times our discipline was accompanied with punishment but most of the time it was administered with reward and encouragement.

Take note of the word itself: discipline. Do you see another word there? A word that is applied to you and me and our relationship to Christ. That's right – disciple. Disciples are people steeped in the discipline of the Master. You cannot be a disciple if you are unwilling to undergo the discipline of the Way set forth by the Master.



The author of the Letter to the Hebrews reminds us of this in today's second reading. He encourages us to view our trials, and we all have them of one type or another, as "discipline." Our trials are not punishment any more than the athlete who pushes himself to exhaustion in order to excel in his sport. Such drive is not punishment but the willing acceptance of a discipline. The discipline does not disappoint. For those who place themselves under it find their endurance strengthened and solace even in their pain.

It would be wrong of us to think that life is meant to be a bed of roses without thorns. Our life in this world, on this pilgrimage to God, is full of its joys and its sorrows, its ups and its downs. The difference for a Christian disciple is that the sorrows and downs are just as important and necessary as the joys and ups. For in our difficulties we are impelled to trust more deeply in God. Growing in this trust is a good thing! That is why Christian spiritual writers since the first days understood suffering for the sake of the Name and the daily trials we undergo as not evil punishments but invitations to enter more deeply into communion with

God who binds up our wounds.

Indeed, they saw what the world called "misfortune" as the most fortuitous way God calls us closer to him. This is a mystery, not to be solved but to be entered into, to be experienced. So the next time things are going south, remind yourself that what appears as misfortune can most certainly be an invitation to go to God, to run to him. The thorns do not disappear but the blood they draw is comingled with Christ's blood which sanctifies it and makes it for us a way to salvation.
