Baptisms...First time parents at St. Michael must attend a Baptism Prep session before the baptism date can be scheduled. Please call Janice at ext. 8241 to schedule the prep session and/or baptism date.

Marriage....The bride, groom or their parents/grandparents must be active registered members of the parish for at least one year prior to reserving a date for the wedding. The diocese requires that arrangements must be made at least six months in advance of the wedding date in order for the proper personal, spiritual and liturgical preparations of the couple to be completed.

The family is a canvas for the paint brush of God's grace.

In celebrating the family of Jesus, the Holy Family, we do not celebrate a perfect family but one that strives to be whole by being open to God's grace. Joseph, Mary and the child Jesus open themselves up to grow in wisdom and grace first as individuals and consequently as a family. The relationship between mother and child and foster-father always sought balance. When the child Jesus throws the balance off and begins to assume the role of an adult (growing up too fast) with His teaching in the temple, He learns from His mother that His actions had upset many people who love Him. Why? Because He did not really act like an adult in showing concern that His absence would put Joseph and Mary into a parental panic. Jesus had to learn to be respectful of His parents' feelings and they had to learn, as parents do, that their child was not really theirs but that He had a mind of His own.



We reflect on the Holy Family not to make us feel like we can never be like them but to assure us that we can be like them by seeking whole and healthy relationships within our families. A better father or mother or son or daughter is found when we seek a listening heart and an open mind to dream like Joseph, trust like Mary and to give ourselves time to grow like Jesus. The qualities of listening, trusting, having dreams and growing are the basic things needed to be a whole person. Only when we seek God's help and guidance to be a whole person, do we build whole families that are truly holy.



Reflections

The Word

(Readings for January 4th , 2026, The Epiphany of the Lord)

I. *Isaiah 60:1-6*

Darkness covers the earth, and heavy clouds hang over the people. But the light has come and the glory of the Lord shines bright.

II. *Ephesians 3:2-3a, 5-6*

In Christ Jesus, Gentiles and Jews are co-heirs and co-sharers in the saving promise.

III. *Matthew 2:1-12*

The magi from the east followed the star until it stopped over the house. They entered, found the child with Mary, prostrated themselves, and did him homage.
