The Spirit empowers the whole community. Luke's description of the early Church in Jerusalem, in today's second reading, sounds too good to be true, and it probably is a bit too optimistic. Luke may have left out the warts and wrinkles. No matter, the portrait is of the church as it should be, possessing through the Spirit all the resources for healing, helping and caring within the community.

Luke gives us essentially the same portrait three times, not only in Acts 2:42-47 but again in Acts 4:32-37, where the theme is: "The community of believers were of one heart and one mind. Surrounded by the community, the apostles were able to do great things performing "wonders and signs" among the people, just like Jesus had done. The community, the people, the Church, share the transforming power of Christ's own resurrection."

Once again in Acts 5:12-16, we see the transformative power of Christ's resurrection: "Through the hands of the apostles, many signs and wonders occurred among the people. The people carried the sick into the streets ..., so that when Peter passed by at least his shadow might fall on one or another of them. Crowds from the towns around Jerusalem would gather, too, bringing their sick and those who were troubled by unclean spirits, all of whom were cured."



This power that works through the early Church has not dried up. This power is God's DIVINE MERCY. This Divine Mercy, this transforming power, comes through our baptism in Jesus Christ. Admittedly, you and I do not perform such obvious signs nor do we witness them but maybe a few times in our life. However, we participate in the power of the Spirit which can be just as healing and life giving. To truly honor Divine Mercy is to live it. Every time you and I take the time to listen to someone, each time we try to understand another's problems, each time we visit the sick or open our hands to the poor, we begin a chain of life-giving events that transform as powerfully as did the shadow of St. Peter.

The truth about the early Church is that they were given a great gift, the ability to transform the world through their faith and follow the ways of Jesus the Risen One. For the ancient writers, this was best expressed by showing the obvious cures of people. Whether it was as dramatic as told in the book of Acts or in the less dramatic everyday healings that we participate in today, the fact remains that God's power, God's Divine Mercy, is still at work transforming this dead world into something living.

This process of transformation takes time because you and I and those before and after us all have the freedom to choose to participate in God's plan or to ignore God's plan. When you choose to participate, you have to choose it everyday and throughout each day. This is sometimes hard because it will mean that you will be transformed first, then the world around you. We like to see change in others, but in ourselves — well that's another story many times.

The Easter Season of seven weeks is a time to build on our Lenten prayer and works. It is a time to let the real work of transformation happen to us so you and I can participate in the mighty acts of God's healing power for the world.
