The Power of Choice. Choice is the big word, the main concept, the "gospel" of our times. My ability to choose should not be interrupted, limited, or prevented. Indeed, my right to choose as I wish for whatever I wish has been, in recent decades, allied totally with the idea of my personal freedom.

The guiding principle of my ability to choose lies in my personal and unique perspective on what I feel allows me to be most free. Thus, freedom is equated with avoidance of commitments, an avoidance of responsibilities to others, and the avoidance of real facts; like it takes a man and woman to make a son or daughter. It is the embracement of the "to each their own," an artifice of "everyone is the same."

How does this stack up with God's word? The only area of agreement would be that we do have the ability to choose. But, as the Knight in Indiana Jones: The Search for the Holy Grail wisely warned, "Choose wisely." Free choice has rules, for every choice, there is a consequence. The Scriptures are clear that this consequence has either the power to give life or in the end, offer death.

We don't like this kind of talk. We like to negotiate ourselves out of such realities, but there is little negotiation offered in the book of Sirach. So one way we get around this is to make what is good evil, and what is evil good. This is a deception of the highest order and one that should give us grave concern. Our present society is very good at this bait and switch maneuver. "Tastemakers" and pundits of popular opinion play on our emotions leading us to believe that if we hold to the good as given to us by our Lord, we really are evil, and we don't really understand Jesus. How far from the truth could this be? In today's Gospel, Jesus makes no excuse for telling the truth of the matter.

Murder is not just killing with a weapon; it is destroying another with words or anger. Adultery is not just the act of sex with someone to whom you are not married; it is all the temptations that lead to such behavior, from strip clubs to seeing another human being as simply someone to satisfy one's desire. Divorce is not a simple matter of issuing a decree; it has consequences far more serious than alimony. Lapses in enthusiasm for one's marriage commitment are part of life. They are signs that renewed effort needs to be made for the benefit of both husband and wife. Even oaths are to be re-imagined as Jesus calls us to the reality that He presumes that we say what we mean and that we do what we say. Honesty is not just the best policy; it's the only policy before God.

It is difficult to digest into these lessons, but digest them we must if we are to be honest to who we are as children of God, children of Truth, children of Life and children of Light. Don't be overshadowed by the confusion of the times labeled as progressive. True progress cannot be found in ignoring what the Word of God teaches or worse, still rewriting it for our sensibilities. We do not have an easy way, because Jesus also teaches us to act always with charity towards everyone just as our Heavenly Father acts. This is why we need prayer, private and public, to help us and open us to God's truth.

Your Gifts, Expertise and Enthusiasm Are Needed! For our parish to function well, the gifts and talents you possess are needed. Participating a bit more in parish life has its rewards and gives people who have done so a new and more vibrant insight into what it takes to make St. Mike's tick. We need your help with five important councils/committees. The Parish Pastoral Council, the Finance Council, the St. Michael School Advisory Committee, the Home and School Committee, the Sports Advisory Committee, and the Faith Formation Advisory Committee.

There are no nominations and no elections. Committee members are determined through a process of DISCERNMENT. This is the same way the Apostles came to choose those who would help them. The discernment process is painless, and even a bit fun. You and other interested parishioners simply come to two Wednesday evenings - March 6 and March 13 7:00 PM-8:30 PM. The two evenings depend on each other and assist you in knowing the functions of these different groups and the issues with which they are dealing.
