
Light & Salt. Last Sunday we heard the Beatitudes from Matthew's Gospel. The passage this Sunday happens right after Jesus preaches about those attitudes we are to strive for in our daily life. You and I are called to live those attitudes. Today this call becomes much more specific, even though it is couched in some symbolic language. Jesus tells us that God has chosen us to flavor and brighten the lives of those around us. However, to be flavor and light means more than the generic "giving good example."

The flavor we are expected to be is the distinct flavor of justice. This flavor is God's justice, which has as its aim, unity in God's love, not condemnation and separation. As salt of the earth, we are called to flavor the earth with the taste of God's justice, a justice concerned with saving not destroying.

That light, we are called to be, is the light that reveals God in our midst. It is not our light that is to shine, but Christ's light through our actions. As light for the world, we are chosen to participate in the light and life of God, and thus be the light that leads others to God. Your daily life and mine, at work, at play, at home and in the larger community is the beacon Jesus has chosen to use to bring people to Himself.

This is no small inheritance and no small responsibility. You see, even though Jesus often spoke in metaphors or parables, He was not a pundit or a trendy philosopher. Jesus did not come to urge us to live by slogans. Jesus came to teach us how to stand apart from the world even as we are sent into the world. Jesus came as a fiery prophet, calling us to jump headfirst into this world, not to be drowned in its passions and cares which are far more concerned with the individual and not the whole.

The flavor and light we bring is God's; it refreshes and enlightens us, urging us to prepare the world and ourselves for God's social order. Jesus did not come to preach lackluster love of the status quo. Rather, Jesus came demanding from His followers a will that burns with energy in order to create all things new. For this we have been called and chosen, and it is for this that we have been given God's grace. We have been made light in the waters of our baptism and sent to salt our time and place with God's vision for our world. This is only accomplished when you and I seek to understand God's Will revealed to us in the scriptures and the teachings of His Church, coming to understand it, and to then carry it out in our daily life.





- I. Sirach 15:15-20
Immense is the Lord's wisdom. The Lord God sees every created thing and understands every human deed. Human beings have life and death before them, and they receive whichever they choose.
- II. 1 Corinthians 2:6-10
Paul wrote that real wisdom is God's: hidden, mysterious, planned and prepared from the very beginning for the glory of those who love the Lord.




