Hope in Action. Hope is always a purposeful movement to believe that our circumstances can and will be better. Hope is always about looking forward, and finds little energy in looking backwards. Hope is always the desire to experience something that pushes us forward toward God. This kind of hope stirs us beyond our own individual pursuits and concerns. This is the virtue of Hope, which is expressed in the virtues of Faith and Love. The hope in the things that endure has fueled Christians throughout the centuries to establish ministries of care and concern for the sick, the poor, the uneducated, the young and the old, the distraught and those burdened with fear and guilt. It has fueled the building of churches, hospitals, schools, centers of administration and retreat houses.

Hope is one virtue that is often under attack. The great Deceiver would have you and I believe, not in God's promise but in our own selves alone, in our own way of seeing things. He tempts us to ridicule hope, painting hope as childish and unrealistic. He gives credence to our fears because fear is the only thing that can jeopardize hope. Fear turns us inward, and this is exactly what the devil desires.

However, over the last 152 years, in the most difficult times (like the Depression), St. Michael's has acted upon hope, ministering to thousands in many and important ways; that is the hope and promise we celebrated at our 150th and are celebrating this year with the 125th Anniversary of our School. This Hope needs to persevere in the coming years too.

Perhaps some feel that they are done with work that needs to continue on at St. Michael's. This is an understandable feeling from the individual perspective. Keep in mind though that one's individual perspective can often be the very barrier to God's work being accomplished. In the Opening Prayer today, we prayed that God "direct our actions according to His good pleasure", not mine or yours. In doing this, we prayed that we would "abound in good works in the name of His beloved Son, Jesus." This being the case, it would not be me who gets to bow out, but it would be God who brings my work to a conclusion. Perhaps our "enough" finds some basis in fear, fear about the unknown, fear that promises it can see into the future when, in fact, its vision is so shortsighted, it can only see the present. Fear seeks to kill Hope. Hope, on the other hand, seeks to make us lively in action.

Fortunately, many have not given in to fear. Their trust in the hope for a better tomorrow has brought a fruitful compilation to the first goal of our "Growing Into the Future Together" (G.I.F.T.) campaign. A state-of-the-art, energy efficient HVAC system is completed in our school building. Our children both in school and in Faith Formation can breathe, literally, much easier.

In the late 1990's, it became apparent that the parish needed a new church building. The second church building from 1929 was not sufficient to hold the worshipping community and was deteriorating quickly. There was much consternation at that time about this situation. Indeed, the Bishop of that era, Bishop Gaughan, looked to split the parish, establishing a new parish south of Rt. 30. Fr. Connolly, the pastor at that time, knew this would be a death knell for St. Michael's. The new parish would be more populous but would not have a school while St. Michael's would struggle to keep its school open. This was already happening in neighboring Dyer. The parishioners were torn. Do we hold on to a building unable to serve this growing community and split the parish, or do we trust in a new direction and raise the funds for a new church building? If the plans to split this parish would have taken place, I can assure you that it would not have survived. Merrillville is a good example. Saints Peter and Paul were split. The school ended up closing and the parish followed suit as well. That parish was older than St. Michael's. Those who trusted back in the late 90's had the courage, tenacity and generosity to move forward secured the status of your parish to this day.

We now have a similar challenge. Our Sunday Mass attendance continues to grow once again. I have met a number of people who have chosen to come here to worship and be part of this community. This trend will only grow as the Diocesan planning process nears completion with an announcement from the Bishop in the next few months. We need to be prepared to welcome new parishioners as well as present parishioners to a parishioner service center that is accessible, inviting, safe and efficient. The present structure is not fully accessible, it is not inviting, it is using up any sense of safety, and it certainly is not energy efficient. The building was never intended to be a public building. It was a house for the Sisters of St. Francis. The north half is 105 years old. The south half is nearly 75 years old. Like the church of 1929, it cannot service this parish as it grows in this new century.

When you come to plan your loved one's funeral, or your children come to marriage preparation appointments, or you come to schedule Mass intentions, or you or others come for counseling and meetings, when volunteers come to do works of charity in your name as our Good Samaritans, and when we welcome new parishioners, a parishioner service center that is safe and secure is not a luxury but a necessity. This is the second goal of our G.I.F.T. campaign. Your participation is so necessary

If you have not participated thus far in the G.I.F.T. challenge, you need to consider helping to keep your parish remain an anchor for Schererville and beyond. The question is where do we want to be in 15, 20, 30, 100 years from now? This is the question that those who are buried in our parish cemetery asked and answered with courage and hope. Should we do any less? Are we any worse off than they were?

Soon a new GIFT kiosk will open in the Gathering Space. The "Wise Guys" are there to help you know the need and to facilitate your generosity. Please take advantage of their presence.






