Not an Ending -- A Beginning. Pentecost marks the beginning of the mission of the Church. It closes the Easter Season but pushes us forward into mission. Often we are satisfied with maintaining our relationship with Jesus. But maintenance for you or me or our parish is not enough. The mission that begins with the anointing of the Holy Spirit is much more than maintenance. Our parish is our base of operations. We sometimes confuse the health of a parish by its financial assets. Financial stability is a good thing, but it is useless unless it serves the mission of the Church to bring Christ into the world by bringing Christ into the lives of both the poor and needy and the lives of those who are well-off.

We all need to take seriously our anointing with the Holy Spirit. You and I are anointed for a purpose, our parish is there to help, encourage and sometimes prod us to honor that purpose, to be the presence of Jesus to others, face to face and on Facebook. Our online presence must reflect our anointing too, otherwise a person can be like a Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde. Charity, above all else, is the hallmark of the Christian even in online forums.

If we are open to the Holy Spirit in our daily life we begin to reflect Jesus in our decisions. How we use our time: is it mainly for my enjoyment or in service towards someone else? How we use our financial resources: is it primarily for my security and entertainment or shared with those who have not? How do we pray: for my own needs or remembering over and above my own needs the needs of the destitute, the lonely, the prisoner, the forgotten sick? When the Holy Spirit fuels our decisions daily our actual life changes.

The apostles did not remain in the upper room after the Spirit descended on them like tongues of fire. No, they went out immediately and began to speak of how Jesus changed their lives. Yet, they all knew they needed to stick together, to renew their fire each week at the Altar of the Lord. We often get excited about recommending a restaurant to a friend. Such excitement cannot be reserved to passing things. You and I must kindle the Divine excitement of the Holy Spirit to boldly tell others (children, family and friends) that coming to Christ's Table each week is the place where life is renewed for the real pleasures that last.

Mark Your Calendars! Put an Alert on Your Smart Phone! On Sunday, June 7th we will celebrate the Feast of the Corpus Christi. At the end of the 11:30 AM Mass we will have a procession with the Blessed Sacrament in honor of our Lord and Savior. Along the route we will have altars set-up to pause for prayer and song and special blessings (Benedictions) given with the Blessed Sacrament. **FIRST COMMUNICANTS** are especially invited to dress in the First Communion clothes to help lead the procession. All our prayerful labors are rewarded in the end with a wonderful lunch provided for all the "pilgrims" who walked with Jesus. Whoever said, "religion isn't fun" has never been to one of these festive gatherings.

FESTIVAL DAY 2026. This August we will celebrate our festival. It is a time for us to celebrate, enjoying each other's company, invited friends and family and Parish alumni. When the festival began decades ago, it was a one-day event, and it was the only thing in town. By the 1950's it became a multi-day event and was still the only thing in town. That held true all the way up into the 1990's. Today, there are many festivals that take place in the Town and the Region. One of the reasons for our festival was certainly to celebrate our community with family and friends. This aspect we certainly do not want to lose. However, the reality of the many festivals that exist today leads us to consider the initial impetus of the Festival Day. The Pastoral Council and the Parish Finance Council, after deliberation with the past chairpersons of the festival, have decided to move to a 1-day event, a **Festival Day on Saturday, August 8**. We will continue to have many of the mainstay activities associated with our Festival. So, mark your calendars for a fun day beginning with the Saturday evening Vigil Mass at 4 PM on August 8. The day will run between 5:00-11:00 PM with the MEGA RAFFLE drawing at 8 PM. Much more information will follow, along with opportunities to help make the Festival Day a great success.
