From the Pastor's Desk

Life is full of surprises! The last year and a half have proven to be full of surprises. The agony of the pandemic we cannot seem to shake, the turmoil of divisive politics and the often violent and lawless reaction to all these events. We had become to feel quite secure in our daily lives before February 2020. In this security, life had become less surprising, even mundane for many. There was little need to think about the blessings of a reasonable economy or a stable society. This has changed and with that change, it is tempting to think that God's grace is no longer present. Our most recent events sensitize us to the unpleasant side of surprises. This sensitivity about surprises is good and bad. The good side is that it encourages us to plan so we are not caught in a tight spot. The bad side is that the uncertainty of surprises can tempt us to close ourselves off from new experiences, new people and new ways of understanding God's work in our life, even in the confusion of the events of our day.

Today's feast of the Epiphany is all about surprises and, thankfully, about the goodness of surprises. The surprise is that God has come into the world not just for the chosen people but for all people, even people who don't believe in God. Now this might not come to us as a shocking revelation, but it was to the people of the first century. It could be a revelation for us if we realize that God breaks through to you and me in similarly surprising ways. The difficulties we each face in life can surprise us and become the bearers of God's power and grace. Relationships that are strained can surprise us by inviting us to grow to understand the people we dislike and so understand much more about



who I am. Reaching a "roadblock" in life, feeling at the end of our rope can surprise us by finally forcing us to trust in God, and let God hold me up.

If we have a notion that surprises are to be avoided then we limit ourselves to experience God in our lives. Remember, our God is full of surprises: the God who made a Virgin the mother of God, the God who surprised Elizabeth, the God who surprised the leaders of the people in sending John the Baptist, the God who surprised all of history by first becoming a human being and then freely giving His life so all of us might live in for Him forever. If you want God to act in your life -- be ready for a surprise.

Many Thanks! Many thanks go out to all those who have been extra generous this year with the less fortunate in our community. Those who contributed to the Good Samaritans "Trim-a-Tree," those who helped to purchase more substantial items for the Sisters of Charity in Gary and the Poor Handmaids of Christ at the Sojourner Truth House, for the children at the Carmelite Home, and those who donated food and helped in its distribution will find their thanks most importantly through the prayers of the many people they touched. God bless you.

Yours prayers are needed. I ask you to remember in the kindness of your prayers this week, Ryan, a Christian candidate who will be brought into full communion in the Catholic Church next Sunday on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. He is already baptized in the Christian Faith and has been growing in his relationship with Christ over the past year. He has also been learning about what it means to be a Catholic Christian. Now he is prepared to be Confirmed and brought to the Eucharistic Table for the first time. Please pray for him this week and in the weeks after his reception into the Church.


Marriage Preparation. It is at this time of the year and in the month ahead that many young people get engaged. If you or someone (another Catholic) is getting engaged, please remember that you need to contact the parish office no less than six months in advance. A Catholic looking to get married must be married in a Catholic church witnessed by a Catholic priest or deacon. As Catholics, we believe that marriage is a sacramental state, not just a civil one.

Fr. Jacob, Deacon Ron and I are charged with the responsibility to help couples prepare for the Sacrament of Marriage. Thus, it is best to contact the office sooner rather than later. The preparation period is at least six months, so it is best to contact us nine months from the wedding date.




WHEELCHAIR RAMP MINISTRY KEEPS ON GIVING


