From the Pastor's Desk

Fr. Jacob is writing articles during Fr. Marty's recovery.

Over the past several weeks, we have been exploring the basics of marriage, declaration of nullity (often called annulments), and we even took a little break to talk about St. Valentine. This week, I wanted to pick up on the actual process of a declaration of nullity, and address some myths around it.

When someone finds themselves in a place of being divorced, in order to marry in the Catholic Church, they have to undergo the process of the declaration of nullity, commonly called an "annulment." As I mentioned last week, this is the process of finding grounds or criteria that the marriage in question did not meet all the requirements to be a marriage in the first place. (See last week's bulletin for more on this.)

In order to start the process of a declaration of nullity, one has to contact the tribunal or Church court for their diocese. In our diocese, the contact information for our tribunal can be found here: <a href="https://dioceseofgary.org/office-marriage-tribunal/ma

After someone contacts the tribunal, the person who is seeking the annulment will be interviewed in order to gather testimony surrounding the circumstances of their marriage, their dating and engagement, and the personal history of the couple. In addition, the tribunal will ask the petitioner for permission to contact their ex-spouse, witnesses that knew them when they were married which is most often parents of the spouses, and lastly any other witnesses that knew the couple often before they were married, during their marriage and following.

The elephant in the room is that petitioners are worried the process will be painful, dig up past memories they want to let rest, or produce moments where a priest in an office will wag their finger at them. While certainly the process of interviewing can bring up painful memories or things they would rather not revisit, the goal throughout the process is to promote healing as much as possible. The testimony gathered is also all written by the person themselves, so any moments where someone thinks they have to face their ex in a courtroom style drama is not true. Records are kept private, and are only released to the spouses. The only exception to this are records that are protected by civil law, such as counseling records.

There are many myths surrounding the issue of someone pursuing a declaration of nullity:

- 1. The process costs a lot of money
- 2. The process takes several years
- 3. The ex-spouse has to agree to the process
- 4. Only priests have anything to do with the process

I have heard many people speak of the process of declaration of nullity, but this is not the case. At present, the tribunal of our diocese asks for a \$500 donation for the entire process, which primarily helps defray the cost of the two lay employees that work in the office, which covers just a portion of operating costs. Also, it should be noted that if someone cannot afford the full amount, they can offer less, or nothing at all. The Church CANNOT bar someone from the process because of money.

While time is a tricky question when it comes to declaration of nullity, Pope Francis in 2015 changed the guidelines for how tribunals function in a diocese, how they interact with each other for the declaration of nullity process, and thereby simplified the process. In short, this simplification reduced the time required to receive a decision. Depending on MANY factors, the time required to get a decision takes about six months to a year or more, all depending on the number of cases waiting for a decision, and how quickly witnesses mail back in their own paperwork!

To the last two points, an ex-spouse is notified that the process is taking place, is asked to sign the initial paperwork, and told they will be informed of the outcome of the process. However, if an ex does not wish to cooperate, the process can still go forward without their permission. The Church understands that this can happen, and the lack of cooperation of one person in the marriage does not bar the process of receiving a decision from happening. While the Judicial Vicar, the person in charge of the tribunal of the diocese, is always a priest, employees that work for the tribunal can be anyone that is hired and trained by the Church. Oftentimes, these roles are filled by lay people, but they can also be filled by other priests, or even by religious sisters. This will conclude the venture we have taken on marriage and declaration of nullity. If you have any questions, please talk to Fr. Marty or myself.



Guidelines Regarding Fast and Abstinence

THE LENTEN FAST

Ash Wednesday:

This day is commemorated by fasting and abstinence from meat.

Lenten Fridays:

These days are marked by the discipline of abstinence from meat.

The Lenten Fast is a fast of penance.

Our self-denial is a way of emphasizing our dependence on God.

THE PASCHAL FAST

"The Paschal Fast must be kept sacred. It should be celebrated everywhere on Good Friday, and where possible should be prolonged throughout Holy Saturday."

(Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy #110)

Good Friday through Holy Saturday:

These days are marked by fasting and abstinence from meat. Please note that these days are not part of Lent or the Lenten Fast.

The Paschal Fast is a fast of anticipation.

The observance of this most ancient fast is a solemn way to prepare ourselves for the reception of the Easter Communion.

HOW DO WE FAST?

The customary fast:

This fast allows for only one full meal to be taken during the day. Two smaller meals are permitted, if necessary, to maintain strength according to one's needs. Eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

The fast of the early church:

This fast begins upon rising. No meals are taken until the customary work day (5:00 PM) is ended. A glass of juice may be taken in the morning and simple liquids, such as water, coffee and tea during the day. The fast ends with a brief prayer followed by an adequate meal. For many this may work as a more natural way to fast.

Age Guidelines for fasting:

Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday and who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday.

HOW DO WE ABSTAIN?

Traditional abstinence:

This is the practice of refraining from meat and meat products.

Abstinence as penance:`

Entering fully into the spirit of the Lenten Fast and the Paschal Fast, we are also encouraged to abstain from other foods, practices or activities.

Age guidelines for abstinence:

Abstinence is to be practiced by all who are 14 years of age and older.

PARISH LENTEN PROJECT

During Lent, there are three words that come mind: Prayer, Sacrifice, and Almsgiving. These words remind us of what Jesus did for us. Would you like to become more like Christ? To help keep the season in our lives, there will be crosses representing the above three words on tables in the Gathering Space. As you

come to Mass each week, please take a paper cross corresponding to your Lenten deed and place it on the cross on the table. Here are some examples for you to consider:

PRAYER --attend Stations of the Cross, Eucharistic Adoration or daily Mass, take time to read the Bible, pray for family or special intentions, pray the rosary, visit church.

SACRIFICE—give up sweets, that special cup of coffee, television, movies, or computer time, put the phone away during meal times, limit Facebook time, etc. Sacrifices can also be that one thing you don't want to do but should.

ALMSGIVING (Offering)—donate money, food or other needed items to a charitable organization, participate in Operation Rice Bowl, give your time and talent to someone or group in need.


