From the Pastor's Desk

Rights, Privileges, Responsibilities At this time in our history, as a society, we focus a lot on our personal rights. Our rights are important, but like any good thing too much can lead to an addiction. Addiction renders the individual unable to see the bigger picture. It enables the one obsessed with the thing or concept to dismiss other valid and important aspects of life. Our obsession with individual rights refuses to take into account the rights of the other, especially the most weak and vulnerable. In our recent history the obsession with the rights of one nation against another allows the stronger to devalue the weaker. This give them permission to subjugate another human being or even render them less than human and thus not deserving of life.

The larger national version of this obsession finds its roots in the most personal of struggles. The recent possibility that abortion on demand might be overturned brings this struggle to the forefront now more than ever. It seems that the two sides are diametrically opposed. What are we to do? The last time we, as a nation, were so diametrically opposed was the Civil War. That bloody solution is not the most recommended nor the most desirable way to settle such a deep-rooted conflict.

Far better for each of us to consider what sort of right we have as an individual, and the privileges those rights afford us as well as the responsibilities they place upon us. There is not a “right” that does not produce some form of privilege and bear an equal portion of responsibility. This holds true for individuals and for a nation. Ignoring responsibility and assuming the right leads to unbalanced privilege. It is and has been an unbalanced privilege that leads to discontent and conflict.

When it comes to human life, we cannot assume that a personal right overrules the biological reality of how human life is formed and exists. The formation of a human being has a distinct biological progression during which, very early on, the potential human being is individualized, they become an individual. The argument that the invitro human being has no rights because they are not fully human overlooks the fact that once the child is born they still cannot exist without the full-time support of mother and father, indeed of the whole human community. If being able to exist this side of the womb on your own gives you rights then all newly born infants fail the test. So too would those born with severe challenges. Bearing, carrying a human being in development is not meant to be an unintended circumstance; it is how we are created. Conversely, using it as a reason to devalue the work and talent of women is also unacceptable. For, without women, the human race would not endure.

Carrying a developing human being, and individual, places both the mother and the father in a position of responsibility. The parents of a newborn are responsible for their care, feeding and growth and failing to honor this responsibility can result in serious charges of neglect. In this the individual rights of the mother and father are subservient to the greater right of the weak individual, the baby. The responsibility does not begin when we emerge from our mother’s womb. During the whole course of pregnancy the stronger individuals bear a responsibility to the weaker individual.

The logic of the “pro-choice” argument rests on the claim that the mother’s individual rights should override the rights of the weaker individual she has the responsibility to carry. Thus, “might makes right.” Such an approach is untenable and unjust and unforgiving. It is not unreasonable to claim that this approach has indeed infected our present situation of violence that seems to reject any value to a human life.

The privilege to live without fear, and to exercise my individual rights cannot come without accepting the concordant responsibilities. To do so leads to an unjust situation. The justice is not for people who participate in the Right-to-Life movement, the justice is for the ones who cannot speak for themselves, the human beings, the individual developing in the womb of their mother. If sexual freedom means that a whole class of individuals (the most venerable) have to be sacrificed or ignored or devalued then the freedom sought is really slavery and not sustainable.

The struggle is not resolved by a ruling or a law. This struggle is for the human spirit, the human soul. It is a struggle that cannot rest on the ups and downs of political movements. It is a campaign of conversion, not to treat any potential human being, any individual as a pawn in a larger game of passing power or influence. Even if one does not believe in God, one cannot deny how we biologically (scientifically) develop, without perpetuating the risk of devaluing all of human life.
