From the Pastor's Desk

“This is my Body. This is my Blood.” Our reception of His Body and Blood is a profession of faith, a proclamation of what we truly believe, that is, that we are not one with Jesus or each other by our own doing but because Christ has made us one with Him in Holy Catholic Church. My unity with Christ at communion is only one aspect of the sacrament. It is also my unity with all that His Church teaches, believes and professes to be true.

We do not believe that the consecrated bread and wine are just some kind of special “holy” food, like Easter Baskets blessed on Holy Saturday. We need to take a lesson from watching how the Body and Blood of Jesus is handled, and how you are taught to handle it. If there is too many consecrated hosts for a Mass it is reserved in the Tabernacle. If there is too much to reserve, it is reverently consumed, like the consecrated wine, before we continue on with Mass. The vessels we use are not thrown into the dishwasher; they are “purified” first with reverence so that nothing remains of the Sacred Body and Blood. Then they are properly washed. When we enter the place where the Body of Christ is reserved, at St. Michael’s that is our chapel, we do not bow, like we do to the Altar, we genuflect in reverence for the Sacred Presence. If I truly understand what I am receiving, I would not do so in a state of serious sin. I need to be as ready as possible to be open to the grace He gives me in this holy encounter.

This kind of reverence for this sacred food and drink is not like what one would encounter in churches that are not Roman Catholic or Orthodox. Our Protestant brothers and sisters do not regard the Eucharist as we do. So, though we might be similar in some aspects – in this central symbol of our unity with God and each other as Christ’s Church, we are vastly different. When I visit a church not in union with Rome, I can certainly pray with them but I cannot take communion there, because they believe much differently than we do. Rather, I pray for unity one day when we can really believe the fullness of what Christ teaches through His Church and so be truly one, not just one to make me feel good at the moment.

We believe that the Body of Blood of Christ are TRULY His body and blood. The mystery of this exchange of gifts; we offer bread and wine as Jesus told us and receive His Very Self in return, cannot be fully understood in a scientific way. This exchange and the consequent result, our reception of His Body and Blood are like a doorway into the deeper reality of God’s presence in and through us. In this way, the consecrated bread and wine act as symbols, deep revealers of the Truth of God’s Real Presence in the Eucharistic Feast.

Yet, because we celebrate Eucharist often, we sometimes forget the very special gift given to us by our Father. Sometimes people come to communion half dazed, almost startled that they have arrived in front of the priest or the Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion. Our “AMEN” is more like an “amen.” Some people even leave right after receiving communion as if they were in the McDonald’s drive thru. Jesus is not “fast food.”

It takes special effort on our part to pay attention; to consciously remind ourselves who it is we hold in our hands when we make a throne to receive Him. It is necessary for you and I be wide awake as His Body is placed on our tongue, so that our mouth may do more praising of God than complaining. We need to be sober and alert to know who it is we touch to our lips as we drink His Blood that is meant to course through our veins so that we give to others as He has given to us.

This summer many people from around the country will be gathering in Indianapolis for a National Eucharistic Congress. This is a very public act of faith. Gathering around the very real Presence of Christ in the consecrated Host is a proclamation to the world that this is not just bread and wine blessed.

That is why this Sunday we honor our Lord in the Eucharistic Species with a festive procession following the 11:30 AM Mass. If you have come to an earlier Mass, please feel welcome to join the procession after the 11:30 AM Mass at around 12:40 PM. Our accompanying the Blessed Sacrament with prayers and songs both heightens our love for this great Gift and proclaims in a very public way our devotion to our Lord Jesus. The procession winds its way through our beautiful parish grounds as we stop and pray at several altars prepared by different parish groups. After the final Benediction, everyone is invited to St. Patrick Hall for some good food and company.






