An Eternal Conundrum! We all grapple with the age-old question “why do bad things happen to good people?” In considering this timeless question we cannot forget the wild card in human relationships. That wild card is the gift of our free will. You and I have ‘freedom of will’ to do what we please.

If everyone chose to please God and to be open to His Will, revealed to us in the Scriptures and our Christian tradition, then the problem of evil would not exist. But the reality is that we can choose to do God’s Will or I can choose to do my own will. Even if you are a Christian in name it remains for all of us to strive to be a Christian. In fact, that is to act as Jesus did who fulfilled the Father’s Will not his own.

In all honesty both you and I, more times than we care to remember, are part of this latter group too. We might view ourselves as “good” people because we did not murder someone or cheat on our spouse or defraud another person. But goodness is not merely the absence of doing wrong. Goodness is the pursuit of doing good. In this vein, we try and sometimes succeed, but we also at times choose not to participate in doing good. This is our free will in action.

When this is taken to a larger scale there are larger consequences. Should God then intervene, suspending a person’s free will? God is not a dictator who deprives His people of their rights. God is our Father who calls us to follow in His ways but loves us even when we choose not to do so. Our freedom to choose is what makes our love so pure when we choose to give ourselves over to God. If we freely choose to do things God’s way, our devotion is not tainted by coercion.

Jesus’ sacrifice is so pure because it is freely given by Jesus. Jesus suffered for doing good, that is for bringing God’s message which challenged those who choose to do their own thing, not God’s. St. Peter, in the second reading tells us: “It is better to suffer for doing good, if that be the will of God.” So, being good and doing good is not an immunization against evil. Peter reminds us never to shy away from telling others why we still do good in the face of evil. He tells us to be firm but gentle in showing others that our good works in God’s name, will not be moved by indifference, hatred or name calling.

If you follow the message of Jesus’ call to love others as He loved us, you might suffer for making that choice. The Jesus we follow did not say “anything goes” or “whatever feels right for you is best.” He came to do the Father’s Will which is not hard for us to know. We are told plainly what the Father’s Will is in the commandments made perfect, which is Jesus’ commandment of sacrificial love. Indeed, Jesus teaches us how to be obedient to God. Obedience means realizing and accepting that there are truths, eternal truths, that need to rule our hearts and, thus, our actions.

Trying to be good by avoiding sin is only one step on the path; the next is actively seeking the Good, what God wills for us, by the decisions you or I make. We must take the second step if we want to follow Jesus in sincerity.

A Mother’s Love. Our mothers try very hard to show us true love, Divine love. Like all human beings some are able to do this more clearly than others. Nonetheless, the very fact that we were born makes us realize their love, they loved enough to be cooperative with God’s creating hand. It is for their willingness to bear us and raise us and love us that we give thanks today. Christian mothers have a grand example in the Blessed Mother who is open fully to God’s Will and never loses hope even at the foot of the Cross. Her openness to God is fully justified in her Assumption. A mother’s openness to bring a life into the world is blessed by God as well and prepares her for her eternal reward too.

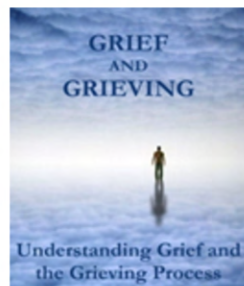
