

Baptisms...First time parents at St. Michael must attend a Baptism Prep session before the baptism date can be scheduled. Please call Janice at ext. 8241 to schedule the prep session and/or baptism date.

Marriage....The bride, groom or their parents/grandparents must be active registered members of the parish for at least one year prior to reserving a date for the wedding. The diocese requires that arrangements must be made at least six months in advance of the wedding date in order for the proper personal, spiritual and liturgical preparations of the couple to be completed.

From the Pastor's Desk

Persistence pays off! It is no secret that reaching certain goals takes time. Before the days of easily obtained credit cards there was "lay-away." I remember my mother going to the back of the store to pay on some item or items she had on lay-away. Her persistence, like that of many others, obtained many things that were unaffordable if they had to pay all at once.

Over time the concept of putting something on lay-away was too slow because even though you could choose what you wanted, you did not take it home until you had paid for the item in full through the lay-away plan. As credit cards became more predominant, so did the feeling that I should be able to take home anything I wanted and use it while I pay it off. This expectation of near instant gratification seems appealing but has little to do with real life.

It's no secret that Americans are all too often overcome by too much credit card debt. Sometimes its legitimate, like medical debt, but all too often it has more to do with our feeling that I should have what I want, when I want it. Consequently, the credit problem is not mainly one of poverty, but one of prosperity as well. Many people are realizing that prosperity is not being able to buy (usually by credit) everything I want at this very moment. Instant gratification leads to unnecessary debt, and debt leads to a host of other problems.

In real life instant gratification is impossible. Real gratification takes time. Perhaps this is why the slow growing gratification of marriage is not appealing to an age that looks for, indeed expects, instant reward. The only instant gratification available is induced by chemicals, drugs, and alcohol. Notice, these are things that actually suspend reality for the user. A suspension of reality is a lie because reality is not really suspended. On the other hand, reality is made far more complex by this often unchecked desire for instant satisfaction. Yet, the expectation for instant "whatever" grows stronger each year.

In this environment the work of prayer seems archaic. Prayer is not about instant satisfaction. Prayer is about persistence. Whether that may be my private devotional prayer daily, my reading of scripture on a regular basis, or my necessary prayer with God's people with my parish community every week. Prayer is a process, a process that builds. This is why Jesus is so insistent about being faithful to prayer even when it seems to be going nowhere.

Persistence in prayer actually demonstrates the gift of faith on the part of the supplicant. How? It demonstrates your faith that God is attentive to you and that even though it does not always go your way, God still invites you to see His way. Being faithful in prayer, both private and communal, is like the child who is faithful to his/her parents. The parents do not always give what the child asks for but the child does not lose faith in the parents. The child's faithfulness is ultimately a sign of the child's love. So being faithful in our prayer is our way of saying: "I love you God and want to know you better." Pray always, never lose heart.




A Special Opportunity of Grace






