#### From the Pastor's Desk-

**Pride of place.** Playing favorites never rests easy with most people unless, of course, you're the favorite of someone. Favoring one child over another or one student over another seems to go against our belief that all should be equal. Though we might feel equality should be the rule of thumb, we are all susceptible to the game of playing favorites. That is what makes God's approach to us so unique. God is not moved by my claim or your claim to "pride of place."

The first reading, from the book of Sirach, makes clear that God plays no favorites. God hears both the rich and the poor because in God's eyes financial, social or even emotional status cannot cloud the fact that essentially we are God's children made in God's image. So, when someone claims that God hates any person, that someone slanders God. God hates no one no matter their color, ethnicity, orientation or sinful nature. People that claim God hates gays or black people or people who are not Christian know nothing of God; their god is their own narrow view.

In the Gospel, Jesus reminds us that God hears us when we are most humble. Admitting that we have more in common with the people we find hard to like is the first step to real humility. That does not place me either above or far below my fellow believers. Such humility opens us up to God's work in our lives.

In the end, God doesn't seem to care much whose pockets are lined with whose money, or who is surrounded with the current status symbols, or who receives the adulation of the people. The garden-variety sinner, which is you and me, needs to strive to live from the awareness that God is our



only hope and source of happiness. This is what humility is, as the word means — "being close to the Earth." Being rooted in God and His law of love brings health to our persons. Depending upon God's abundance will bring to the believer all that you need to live and grow.



## Ministry in Action: Wheelchair Ramp Ministry Completes its 100th Install!

The St. Michael's Wheelchair Ramp Ministry began after a 2019 NWI Times article about the Kiwanis of Valparaiso building ramps in nearby counties. With their guidance, the effort was brought to Lake County. Thanks to the support of Deacon Tom Kubik, Fr. Martin Dobrzynski, and the Diocese of Gary's Mercy Fund, the ministry was established within one month. The first ramp was installed on November 2, 2019, in Miller. Since then, more than 100 ramps have been installed throughout Lake County communities including Whiting, East Chicago, Gary, and Crown Point. Funding has come from the Diocese of Gary Mercy Fund, Legacy Foundation, Praxair-Linde, J.W. Anderson, Franciscan SIPP grants, Crown Point Community Foundation, Schererville Civic Foundation, Lions Club of Dyer, and generous parishioners. This ministry's success is a testament to the power of the Holy Spirit and the good that can happen when faith is

put into action. God is good!




